

BBB Webmaster Report January 2014

2014's first report will start by looking back at 2013. During the last 12 months, the club's website had 1,463 visitors who viewed 3,968 pages. For those of like averages this is 122 visitors each month who viewed an average of 2.7 pages during each visit. January, March, May and August were the months with the most traffic, and visitors from across the continental US and a few overseas locations found us on the Web. The most popular pages viewed include the newsletter, calendars, for sale, links, and officers/contact information. The webmaster typically received 2-4 emails per month with inquiries from potential new members, car owners seeking parts/services, sales and marketing promotions, and email from other car clubs (often other webmasters).

DID-U-KNOW by Facia Nearside

It is said that nothing spawns success like failure, and in the late 1940s failure is exactly what Jaguar was experiencing. Brake failure that is. It's actually just a matter of physics. If you double the speed of a vehicle it takes four times the braking capacity to stop it. Jaguars had the ability to go fast. In what at first seems like a backward bit of logic, they were only going to be able to exploit that ability if they had better brakes.

Teaming up with Dunlop, Jaguar embarked on an ambitious program of research and testing which developed a reliable caliper type disc brake. It first appeared on the 1953 C-Type race car before going on to equip their road going machines.

The success of the new brake design was beyond question, but in fact it was not new at all. The disc brake was invented some 50 years earlier by another Englishman, Frederick W. Lanchester. Mr. Lanchester had one of the keenest minds ever connected with the automotive industry. In 1902 at the age of 34 he was building automobiles equipped with engines, transmissions and brakes all of his own design. That the brakes were not very reliable at that time was due only to the lack of high tech materials for their construction. Since his motorcar had only 10 HP anyway, the idea was simply shelved for 50 years before it was time for it to mature.


