DID - U - KNOW by Facia Nearside

At the 1958 Earl's Court Motor Show a beautiful new British sports coupe debuted, the Peerless GT. It had a sexy fiberglass body, could travel at over 110 mph and seat four adults in comfort. The engine and transmission were lifted directly from a Triumph TR3 while the name was taken from, yes.....an American truck. An unusual combination to be certain, but as is often the case there were many unexpected turns along the way.

In 1911, the Cleveland, Ohio based Peerless Motors began making trucks for the U.S. Army. When WWI broke out, England bought 12,000 of the trucks for use in Europe. At war's end, with so many surplus trucks scattered around the continent, a company called Slough Lorries LTD was set up to refurbish and sell these trucks to the civilian market. Fast forward 30 years and that company decided to try their hand at making automobiles. Now known as Peerless Cars LTD, they chose the only name that they knew and called their product the Peerless GT. Although production ended in 1960 after only 325 units, you can still find one more easily today than one of those 12,000 trucks!

As for one last twist.....the name Peerless did not become an issue between the two companies on opposite sides of the Atlantic. That's because Peerless Motors of Cleveland, Ohio abruptly shifted gears in 1931 and began producing beer instead of vehicles. You know it today as Carling Black Label.

WINTER CAR REBUILDS

ROXANN CANNISTRA'S JAGUAR PROJECT 2015



WINTERTIME TRAVELLER PROJECT 2015

My Traveller project has moved for the winter from an unheated garage to the basement workshop. There is a limited amount of mechanical stuff you can do in the workshop, so most efforts are going into finishing the wood parts. There are approximately ninety-five wood parts in the Traveller, some of which are built into assemblies, such as the side timber frames and the rear doors. Most of this wood requires several coats of spar varnish. This is the best material for UV and weather protection. It also remains somewhat flexible so that joints aren't as likely to open up with atmospheric changes.

It's a time consuming process. Each coat of varnish must dry for at least a day before it can be sanded. So, we're talking about at least two days for each coat to dry, get sanded, and the next coat applied. I might also mention that most of the parts had to be stripped of the old finish and sanded before any new finishing could begin. If you come to my house you had better be ready for that sweet aroma of varnish in the air!





The assemblies pictured are the side timber frames. One of the frames that came on the car was in fair condition and was restorable. The other side had joints that were so rotted out that the whole thing had to be replaced. While all of the wood parts are available from England, they're expensive. Since I had found a local source for the Ash material, I opted to build the frame from scratch. This was accomplished only through the wonderful generosity in terms of time, equipment, facilities and expertise of my friend, Ed Lehman. Not only is Ed an expert woodworker, he is also a machinist at heart. All of the joints were made to micrometer precision on a vertical mill used in metalworking. You won't find better wood joints anywhere! Thanks, Ed!

So there you have it. A lot of work has been done, but there is still much to do. One must remain optimistic. Perhaps 2015 will be the year!




