HISTORY AND WINE A WINNING COMBINATION FOR OUR FIRST DRIVING EVENT

On Saturday, May 10, 2014 we're going south to DeKalb (warmer down south). We will gather at Noon at Kegel's Motorcycle Store, southwest corner of Harrison and Perryville Roads. So have an early lunch, or do a drive through. We will depart at 12:15 p.m.

To start our day, Larry and Marsha Eils will lead you on a short drive to DeKalb where we will visit the Ellwood Mansion. In 1879 Isaac Ellwood built a fabulous 3 floor mansion. A one hour tour (\$6/person) will reveal how Isaac formed a partnership in 1874 with Joseph Glidden to form the world's first barbed wire factory. By 1879, 50 million

pounds of barbed wire were being purchased annually, and Isaac was on his way to becoming one of the wealthiest men in Illinois. There is a gift shop for those interested.

Then we're off to Aquaviva Winery for a tasting (\$6/person). This family owned 40 acre estate vineyard grows all their own grapes to produce 11 handcrafted estate wines. You will be amazed at the Mediterranean style winery sitting on top of a hill. They also have an interesting gift shop.

To end the evening we will visit Sorrento's, an "old fashioned" supper club right here in northern Illinois, for dinner. They serve Italian and American Cuisine specializing in Prime Rib.

BBB MICHIGAN ADVENTURE 2014

As one of the most onerous winters on record finally begins to retreat in the rearview mirror the dream of LBC driving looms large. While snowbound in our winter cave, the BBB Events Committee has been hard at work planning post hibernation activities. We are pleased to announce the club long weekend in September and believe that it will be a gem. The possibility also exists that this is an adventure that will never be able to be repeated. Let me explain.



Just 175 miles north of Rockford at Manitowoc, WI, one of the most unusual ferry boats in the United States plies it's trade. The SS Badger, launched in 1953, still uses coal for fuel as it crosses Lake Michigan. It is the only remaining passenger carrying boat in the United States using this type of propulsion, and it may soon be forced to retire. Using coal for fuel is not the problem, the disposing of the ashes is. You see, the Badger simply dumps the ashes overboard, and this practice has now been deemed unacceptable. After fighting for it's life in the court system for many years the Badger has been issued one final ultimatum: install an ash retention system by January 1, 2015

or cease operation. It is believed that the conversion will be accomplished in time for next year's sailing, but this outcome is less than certain. For that reason this might be the last opportunity to experience a unique bit of history right here in our own backyard.

In a nutshell, the trip we plan is as follows. Depart on Wednesday September 3rd and drive to Manitowoc, WI in time to sail on the SS Badger departing at 2 p.m. Following our 4 hour crossing we arrive in Ludington, MI and remain overnight. Day 2 will find us driving along the Michigan shoreline enjoying the beautiful scenery. We will stop at a winery and have lunch between Suttons Bay and Traverse City. Continuing north we will enjoy the splendid views along Torch Lake, considered to be the third most beautiful lake in the world. Our stop for the evening will be in Petoskey, a charming town on Little Traverse Bay. The next morning we pass through the world famous Tunnel of Trees, with plenty of time to enjoy it's spectacular views. After lunch it is on across the Mackinac Bridge into the upper peninsula with Sault Ste. Marie, MI as our destination for day 3. At Sault Ste. Marie the Soo Locks on the Saint Mary's River between the United States and Canada are the largest waterway management system on earth. Friday evening dinner will be a buffet aboard a tour boat as we cruise through the locks experiencing the operation of this engineering marvel. On day 4 we will drive west along the upper peninsula shoreline. We will be heading to Menominee, MI for the night with a lunch stop planned for picturesque Manistique. During this last day in Michigan spectacular views, lighthouses and other historic sites will compete for our attention. Sunday as we depart toward home, Green Bay will be directly in our path. Stadium tours anyone?

Group arrangements have been made for the Lake Michigan crossing (SS Badger) and the Soo Locks Dinner Cruise. There is a block of hotel rooms reserved for each night's stay as well. Please refer to the following information for prices, locations and dates. You must confirm your own reservation choice at each of these venues. We have obtained the best possible rate at each of these locations but it is possible that an additional discount could be available for factors such as age, AAA or AARP membership, frequent British car driver, etc. so please inquire at the time you make your reservation. Also, please contact Roxann Cannistra to let us know that you will be joining in on the fun so that we are sure that our preparations are adequate.

The ídea that a Britísh luxury automobíle marque would be founded by an Amerícan opera sínger and named after a ríver in Ohío sounds líke a tale too tall to be true. Indeed it probably would have seemed unlikely as well to the 32 year old preacher's son who accomplished it.

Born in Springfield, Ohio, Wilbur Gunn relocated from the United States to Britain at the age of 32 in order to pursue his career in opera. Soon he became interested in motorcycles however, and began building them in the garden of his house in Staines, Middlesex. Successful right from the start, one of his machines won the London-Edinburgh Trial in 1905. Seeing the public's increasing desire for automobiles, Gunn changed to four wheeled vehicles in 1907. Again an immediate success, one of his design won the London-St. Petersburg Trial in 1910.

Wilbur Gunn passed away in 1920. Sadly the financial dark clouds of the Great Depression and two world wars took their toll. After changing hands several times, David Brown eventually bought Gunn's company in 1947 and merged it into the Aston Martin empire. As for that river in Ohio...it is now gone as well, having been renamed Buck Creek. But when Wilbur Gunn was growing up near Springfield in 1875 it was known as Lagonda.

Tech Article- Preparing for the driving season

Over the years there has been a checklist developed of things you may want to check on your car before starting the driving season. I realize that it seems pretty extensive however do what you feel comfortable with and have someone else do the rest. Most of the list can be done using jack stands and a creeper. Quite a bit of this list is from various articles written by John Twist, some from my personal experiences and some from other club members experiences.

- · Clutch slave cylinder for leaks
- Rear end oil level
- · Transmission oil level
- Oil leaks engine, trans, rear end

- Engine compression
- Engine timing
- Points (if fitted)
- Spark plug condition
- Lifter adjustment
- Lifter travel
- Oil level
- Clutch fluid level
- · Clutch master cylinder for leaks
- Brake fluid level
- Brake master cylinder for leaks
- Coolant fluid level
- Radiator for signs of a leak
- Condition of hoses
- Condition of belts
- Carburetor adjustment

Items to check inside car:

- · Clean battery connections
- · Note battery age
