Thank you to everyone for contributing your goodies and those who shared their favorite teapots for making the tea.




















2015 GARAGE TOUR




BBB DRIVING GUIDELINES

DID - U - KNOW by Facia Nearside

When William Walmsley moved to Blackpool and began making motorcycle sidecars in his garden shed, his 20 year old neighbor, William Lyons, took notice. Lyons was not only a motorcycle enthusiast but he also had a keen eye for style. Walmsley called his sidecars "ot-as-ell" and with their bullet shaped octagonal body they were unlike anything else on the market. Lyons immediately saw the potential, but it took a bit of persuading before Walmsley entered into a partnership in 1922 and the Swallow Sidecar Company was born.

The sidecars sold so well that soon a larger manufacturing location was needed. In 1927 Swallow also began building car bodies, creating the immensely popular Austin Seven Swallow. Fueled by this success, custom bodies for Standard, Swift, Fiat, Wolseley, Morris and Alvis soon followed. The Swallow Sidecar Company became the Swallow Sidecar and Coachbuilding Company. In 1935 William Lyons bought out his partner to become sole owner and Swallow

designed and produced their first car under their new name SS Cars Ltd.

Following WWII, an advanced new twin overhead cam engine was introduced which not only elevated the company's saloons and sports cars above the competition but also powered the way to five Lemans victories. William Lyons became recognized as a styling genius and was knighted for his contributions to the British Empire.

Almost 100 years on, the company is perhaps more successful than at any time in it's past. You will not, however, find Swallow Sidecar or the letters SS related to any postwar products, as those letters have developed sinister connotations. More likely you have heard of Sir William Lyons Car Company by its current name...

Jaguar.


A women's Puffy Vest has been added in addition to the existing fleece vest.


The new vest is available in 6 colors.
