In 1874 Ellwood invented barbwire and in five years became the wealthiest man in Illinois. In 1879 he built a 3 story brick home with indoor plumbing, running water and gas lights. Several years later they became the first home in DeKalb to have electric lights installed. Mr. Ellwood also owned 1,000 acres of land stretching from his home north to Sycamore. After our tour of this beautiful home, we drove through the farm land of Illinois to our next stop, the Aquaviva Winery.









Aquaviva is a unique winery using only grapes grown in Illinois to produce all of their wine selections. They had a nice selection of white and red wines to taste.

After tasting 6 wine selections we took a short drive in the warm sunshine to Sorrento's Supper Club.



The interior of Sorrento's was beautifully appointed. After sitting down we were presented with a large relish tray, an overflowing bread basket along with butter and a great tasting cheese spread. Everyone enjoyed a wonderful meal accompanied with great service.



TECH TIP: FEELER GAUGES

Compliments: Grassroots Motorsport magazine

"Most feeler gauge kits include a 0.0015-inch blade. Using it alongside another blade allows you to create half-sizes between each standard blade size."

"Example: You are measuring valve clearances and your feeler gauge is a loose fit on 0.019-inch, but 0.020-inch is a no-go. Double up the 0.018-inch gauge and the 0.0015-inch and you get 0.0195-inch."



TOOL TECH TIPS

Jim the Tool Man

Channel Locks: Used to round off bolt heads. Sometimes used in the creation of blood-blisters.

Vise Grips: Generally used after pliers to completely round off bolt heads. If nothing else is available, they can also be used to transfer intense welding heat to the palm of your hand.

DID-U-KNOW by Facia Nearside

William Morris (yes, of The Morris Garage fame) began building cars in 1912. Production of 400 cars in 1919 was increased to 56,000 cars in 1925. But Morris had bigger ambitions. Having seen the success of Henry Ford, Morris set out to bring mass production to Great Britain. He teamed up with Edward Budd of the U.S.A. who had developed a process to stamp out steel automobile bodies. In 1926 Morris and Budd formed The Pressed Steel Company of Great Britain.

Within a few years the two strong willed entrepreneurs came to loggerheads. Following a court battle, Morris lost control of Pressed Steel which allowed the company to supply other customers.

By the early 50s Pressed Steel had the largest press shops in Europe with plants at Oxford, Berkshire, Linwood, Swindon and Theale. Customers included Austin, Bentley, Daimler, Hillman, Humber, Jaguar, Lanchester, MG, Morris, Riley, Rolls-Royce, Rover, Singer, Vauxhall and Wolseley. Eventually coming under the British Leyland umbrella the company became Pressed Steel Fisher, the largest independent manufacturer of car bodies in the world.

And what about Pressed Steel today? When BMW acquired Rover in 1994 they inherited the plants at Swindon and Oxford. Body panels for the new Mini are stamped out at what is now called "Plant Swindon" and final assembly of the car takes place at "Plant Oxford".

MORE TOOL TECH TIPS

Jim the Tool Man

Phillips Screwdriver: Normally used to stab the vacuum seals under lids or for opening old-style paper-and-tin oil cans and splashing oil on your shirt; but can also be used, as the name implies, to strip out Pozi-Drive screw heads.

Straight Screwdriver: A tool for opening paint cans. Sometimes used to convert common slotted screws into non-removable screws and butchering your palms.
