Saturday, July 19 should be reserved on your calendars for the BBB Saturday Drive to the Peoria area of Illinois! Larry and Marcia suggested the Kickapoo Creek Cafe and winery outside Edwards for lunch and a wine tasting, followed by visiting the nearby Wheels O'Time Museum in Dunlap. Dinner in Princeton at the Wise Guys Bar & Grill during the trip home has been arranged.

We will meet in the Dairy Queen parking lot at 1601 E. Sandy Hollow in Rockford (at the intersection of By-Pass 20 and Hwy 251) at 8:15 with an 8:30 leave time. The drive down will include scenic Route 2 to Sterling, and then Route 40 to the north side of Peoria. We will not be doing any city driving!

The Kickapoo Creek Cafe is pretty small, so it will help them if we can give an approximate number of people coming. They would like to have preorders if there are more than 12, but we are working with them to either come in 2 groups half an hour apart, or maybe some of us pre-order. Check out Kickapoocreekwinery.com to see their menu. If we find a large number of people planning to drive down, I may contact some of you to ask about a pre-order.

The main attraction will be the Wheels O'Time Museum, an eclectic collection of autos, fire trucks, farm equipment, caterpillar machinery, clocks, musical devices, and much more inside 4 buildings. Their outside displays include a Rock Island steam locomotive, Milwaukee Road combine car, 2 private Pullman cars, a caboose and switch engine, as well as a working windmill. There will be exhibits to satisfy every interest!

The trip back will be Route 29, following the Illinois River north to Princeton where we have reservations at the Wise Guys Bar & Grill, located at the I80/Route 26 interchange. They offer a full range of food, from sandwiches to steaks, and advertise German Specials on Friday & Saturday. The outside is rather plain and nondescript (we almost missed it), but don't let that fool you! The inside is quite nice and the food excellent.

We plan to be in Princeton around 5:00 pm, and should be back in Rockford before dark. We hope that you can join us for a day full of fun driving and exploration of places that the Club hasn't been before. BBB WEBMASTER REPORT JULY 2014

Three items from your webmaster for the month:

- The much anticipated 'traffic' report for the first half of 2014 was shared with the club at the June meeting. For those who missed it, our Site Meter recorded 1,197 visitors over the past 12 months, or a monthly average of 100. On average, each visitor went to 3.3 pages during their visit and their time on the site lasted a 'whopping' 24 seconds. The website traffic trend appears stable; neither increasing or decreasing. Recent US visitors were from Illinois, Colorado, New York, Louisiana, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Indiana, Georgia, and Wisconsin. Recent international traffic came from Brazil, Italy, Mexico, and Taipei. Since the site launched in 2002, our total recorded traffic count is over 22,400.
- ◆ The webmaster received two emails this month, one regarding a local car show and two from a club board members with information to share.
- Recent work to the website included an updated Members Page for 2014 (we have 52% of the club membership pictured on the site); new pictures posted from recent events; updates completed to the calendar of events; and uploaded current and past newsletters.

BBB MICHIGAN ADVENTURE 2014

It seems to me that the warm summer driving weather has just arrived. Yet a quick glance at the calendar will show you that our September 3rd departure for the club long weekend is just 8 weeks away. That means that it is time to throw your hat in the ring, get off dead center, and make plans to join your fellow club members on our sure-to-be-fantastic Michigan adventure! Let me briefly recap our itinerary then provide the details of how to join in on the fun.

We will depart on Wednesday, September 3rd for Manitowoc, Wisconsin where we board the S.S. Badger and sail across Lake Michigan. It's a short day of driving as we let the boat do the work, transporting us to Ludington, Michigan in time for a relaxing waterfront dinner.

- ➤ Day 2-we head north, driving along the beautiful Lake Michigan shoreline to Suttons Bay for a wine tasting and lunch. Petoskey, located on Little Traverse Bay, will be our destination with dinner plans at the Historic Perry Hotel Pub.
- Day 3-we continue north through the "Tunnel of Trees", planning an early arrival in Sault Ste. Marie. The afternoon will be free to explore the museums, shops or local sights. (If you plan to drive across the bridge into Canada, remember to bring your passport!)
- ➤ Day 4-we drive west along Lake Superior's Whitefish Bay (yes THAT Edmund Fitzgerald). We will visit many picturesque locations including the Point Iroquois Light Station and Manistique on the way across the Upper Peninsula to Menominee. Dining for this final evening will be at the world famous River's Edge Restaurant.
- ➤ Day 5-Departing for home on Sunday we plan a mid afternoon arrival, tempered by ice cream stops as necessary.

Now for the paperwork. Several people have said to Roxann and I "of course we are going" or "we wouldn't miss it". But that won't get you on the boat, and it certainly won't get you a hotel room. We have obtained the best possible rate at each location but it is always possible that an additional discount could be available, so ask. Book the 2 p.m. departure from Manitowoc. The automobile as well as each person traveling is a separate reservation, and the 20% discount applies only to persons.

Day 2 September 4 Petoskey, MI Apple Tree Inn 800-348-2901 Rooms \$89

Day 3 September 5 Sault Ste. Marie, MI Askwith's Lockview Motel 800-854-0745 Rooms \$81 (Please note that this is a change from the hotel listed in the April Chronicle)

Day 4 September 6 Menominee, MI AmericInn Lodge and Suites 906-863-8699 Rooms \$90 Queen bed **Note: This hotel has two floors but no lift (elevator to you Americans) so reserve on the first floor if you don't want to walk up.

Soo Locks Dinner Cruise: price for the dinner AND the cruise will be about \$50 per person. All arrangements are being handled by Rich and Roxann and they will collect payment at a later date.

DID-U-KNOW

That a pretty blonde born in Hollywood, California has a British sports car named after her sounds a bit unusual. But then unusual is probably the perfect word to describe the life of Dorothy Deen. She was the 45th woman in the world to earn a helicopter pilot's license, but that's another story.

As a teenager Dorothy was a test driver for Whizzer Motor Bicycles. Next she started a mail order business selling gasoline powered model airplanes. Her real interest was in cars however, and at an early age she bought a new MG TD. Unable to find high quality accessories for her MG, Dorothy and her father, Arthur Anderson, teamed up to design and market their own line calling the company Cal Specialties. Through other business ventures Anderson became involved with the Swallow Coachbuilding Company that was preparing to build a new high end sports car based on Triumph TR2 running gear.

That new sports car debuted at the 1954 Motor Show and was called the most beautiful car on display. Indeed it derived it's name from Dorothy, but if you still don't get the connection you can be forgiven. Taking Dorothy's name and giving it an Italian sounding flair, Cal Specialties sold their line of auto accessories under the name Doretti. Swallow Coachbuilding liked that idea for their new marque as well. Dorothy sold them the rights to the name for one dollar, and in the process acquired North American distribution rights for the new car as well as the west coat distributorship of Triumph. That sharp new British 2 seater appeared in 1954 as the Swallow Doretti.


