When Colin Chapman set out to build cutting edge sports cars in 1948 he approached the task with a host of innovative ideas, most centering around the premise that performance is enhanced more by saving weight than by adding power. After progressing through the first five designs, number six was considered well enough sorted to be a commercial success, although it was only offered in kit form.

It was seven, however, that proved to be Chapman's lucky number. Production, which started in 1957, lasted for 16 years and there have since been over 90 different clones, replicas and derivations. Remaining faithful to his weights saving theme, the car had skinny tires, no doors, no carpet, no heater, no fuel gauge, in fact, no seats. Two cushions, one on the floor and one on the back panel to lean against were all that was provided. It was also narrow and cramped with an uncomfortable ride, yet became one of Britain's best loved sports cars.

Although there is some debate as to the origin of the company name there is no question as to the popularity of Colin Chapman's creation, the Lotus Seven.

CRUISE NIGHT IN OREGON




