Following the Rock River, as always, is a beautiful ride.



Our first stop was at the Kickapoo Creek Winery & Cafe for lunch and wine tasting. Pre-ordering our lunches was a good thing. There was a variety of food offered, and everyone had something they

enjoyed. Those that did the wine tasting had the opportunity to try local Illinois wines. By the time we left, the wine tasting and cafe room was quite busy. A good time to continue on our day's journey.













The Wheels O'Time Museum is located in Dunlap, Illinois, and was just a short drive from Kickapoo Creek. This museum was started by two men interested in preserving a part of history. Many displays showcase the early days of Peoria. We were surprised to learn that there was a car manufacturing business for a time. The outside display of a locomotive and train cars was interesting, and we could climb up and into them for a first hand view. There was one building that is maintained and sponsored by the Peoria Early Ford V-8 Club. They change their exhibit monthly. Currently it's tractors and next month will be Mustangs.



One of the volunteers showed us a Theiman tractor that was sold as a kit for \$150. The farmer then put in his own engine (usually a Ford) and drive train.

There was a large display of old cars - all in good shape - from a Model T to an Austin Healey 3000 to a limo. There were shop displays, old household appliances, airplanes hanging overhead, musical instruments, and a room full of mostly working clocks.





This is a private museum run mostly by well versed volunteers who obviously love their work. We all learned a lot about a lot of different things!

CAR INSPECTION MORE IMPORTANT THAN YOU THINK!

I brought my "B" to the garage to have the splash guards in both front wheel wells replaced. With the car on the lift Ron Kuhnau began poking around the wheel wells to see if there was other rust present. After removing some rust proofing Ron noticed something on the frame. Further scrapping revealed a crack in the frame right behind the bolts holding the front end to the frame, see picture. The crack was large enough to stick the blade of a putty knife into it. The crack actually came down one side, across the bottom and only part way up inside the engine compartment.

Good News - the crack could be fixed. Both Ron and Lyn Pond worked on welding the frame on the wheel side and across the bottom. The welds were ground smooth and then plates were welded over the side and bottom cracks. The inside crack will be welded over this winter when the car goes in for some body work and a new paint job.

So the next time you service your car and put it up on a lift, take a very good look at the car frame and everything else. You just may find something you weren't looking for.



A BIT OF HISTORY: THE BRITISH RYTECRAFT SCOOTACAR

The Stateline News (Beloit newspaper) in their July 23, 2014 issue had some auto trivia about the British Rytecraft Scootacar that prompted some investigation to find out more about it. "The British Rytecraft Scootacar, produced from 1934-1940 by the British Motorboat Manufacturing Company, was based on a children's fairground ride converted for road use and was powered by a two-stroke chainsaw engine. Top speed was estimated at 15 mph."

The transmission was single speed and operated by a single pedal which opened the throttle on being pressed down and applied the brake and when released. The clutch was automatic. There were no springs. Drive was to one of the rear wheels and the single brake operated on the other.

The later cars from about 1939 had a larger 250 cc engine, a three speed gearbox and normal pedal controls. Top speed was 40 mph. Two seats were now fitted along with electric lights. A commercial version, the Scootatruck was also made and for publicity some were styled to look like Vauxhall and Chrysler models. All in all, there were only around 1,000 units produced. Several survive and one is on display at the Brooklands museum. One of these little beauties was driven around the world in the 1960s - it must have taken awhile!

DID-U-KNOW by Facia Nearside

In the early part of the 20th century Britain's largest automobile producer was the Wolseley Motor Company, yet the man whose name was on the cars didn't live long enough to see even one automobile sold. But that is sort of the end of the story, let me start at the beginning.

Frederick Wolseley was born in Ireland but was living in Australia when he designed and built the first powered machine for shearing sheep in 1876. He established Wolseley Sheep Shearing Machine Company in Sydney for production and marketing of the new machines. Englishman Herbert Austin was also living down under at that time and the sheep shearing machine business caused a chance meeting between the two men.

Wolseley traveled to England in 1893 to establish production of sheep shearing machinery on that side of the ocean. Setting up operations in Birmingham, Herbert Austin joined him as manager. Although once again very successful the production of sheep shearing machinery was quite seasonal so Austin began looking for a product that would provide a more constant demand. He became interested in motor cars and built several three wheel versions of his own design but none found a buyer. Wolseley liked this idea however and saw the potential, so he formed the Wolseley Tool and Motor Car Company. Unfortunately Frederick Wolseley died in 1899 and the new board of directors saw no future in automobiles. The motor car company was sold to Vickers and Herbert Austin, now in charge of automobile production, went with it. Under Vicker's ownership, Austin came up with a four wheel design and the success which had previously eluded him was finally realized. By 1906 the Wolseley Motor Company had built more than 1500 cars making it the largest motor car manufacturer in Britain. This number one position continued through WWI and into the early 20s by which time 12,000 cars per year were being produced.

As for Herbert Austin? By now you might have guessed that this is the same Herbert Austin who founded one of the greatest car manufacturers in the world, the Austin Motor Company. But then that's another story. However, next time you see an Austin-Healey, Austin Mini or Austin anything for that matter, remember that it was the Wolseley Sheep Shearing Machine Company that started it all!


