He reported the data isn't consistent with past reports due to the club's inactivity during COVID-19 shutdown but he thought it was still worth sharing. In short, traffic to our site is back and in a big way! For example, for the month of February 2021 the club had 65 visitors to the website, and last month (June) saw 604 visitors. Last year during COVID shutdown (2020) we saw a decline of 27% in visitors to our site, with a total of 1,652 visitors over 12 months. For 2021, year to date, we have already seen 1,609 visitors through June 30. In July we should surpass last year's total. A visitor is defined by the web hosting software as a unique visitor. So, for example, one individual logging in three times is counted as one unique visitor.


BBB WEBMASTER REPORT – AUGUST 2021

DID - U - KNOW


English Racing Automobiles (ERA) was established in 1933 with the aim of producing a team of single seat race cars capable of upholding British pride in international motor sport. Founder Humphrey Cook knew the cost of aspiring to full Grand Prix racing was prohibitive so he aimed ERA efforts at the 1500 cc (voiturette) class of racing. Fortunately, wealthy driver Raymond Mays and Peter Berthon, an accomplished engineer, put their energy and expertise into the project as well.

A factory was established at Bourne, Lincolnshire. The first car had a chassis designed by Reid Railton and a six-cylinder engine very similar to that of a Riley Six, but enhanced for racing in several ways. A stronger forged crankshaft with a large center roller bearing was used and a new aluminium cylinder head was designed. The engine was also super charged with a bespoke design by Murry Jameson. Unusually it ran on methanol, producing about 200 bhp at 6500 rpm.

ERA unveiled this first car, RIA in May 1934. Although it required a bit of sorting, by the end of the year it was scoring notable victories against more established marques. Then in 1935, at a prestigious race in Nurburgring, ERAs took first, third, fourth, and fifth places. For the remainder of the decade ERA dominated voiturette racing. During this time the cars were continuously developed until the second World War brought a halt to motor racing in Europe.

In 1948 ERA was acquired by Leslie Johnson but the name remained dormant. That all changed in 1989 when ERA put its name to the ERA Mini Turbo, the fastest ever version of the original Mini to be sold through official dealers. Today the ERA trademark is owned by Tiger Racing.


