


DID – U – KNOW by Facia Nearside

Engineer, motor cycle racer, race car driver, aircraft engine designer, luxury car producer, and Le Mans winning performance auto manufacturer. Walter Owen Bentley was all of these things and more. Born in Hampstead, London in 1888, he was educated at Clifton College until taking a position as an apprentice engineer with the Great Northern Railway at the age of 16. The five-year apprenticeship taught W.O. (as he was commonly known) to design complex machinery, as well as providing practical experience in how to manufacture it.


At the end of the five-year apprenticeship, he decided the railways did not offer a challenging enough career. In 1912 he joined his brother H.M. Bentley in a company that sold DFP cars. Dissatisfied with the performance of the DFPs, W.O. designed a new piston made from aluminium alloy. Fitted with these alloy pistons and a modified camshaft a DFP set several records at Brooklands in 1914.



At the onset of WWI Bentley knew the use of aluminium alloy pistons would give an important advantage in aircraft engine performance. Security considerations prevented his "broadcasting" this information to engine manufacturers. Instead, he was commissioned in the Royal Naval Air Service and sent to work with the manufacturing companies to share his knowledge. His first consultation was with Rolls-Royce which were at that time designing their first aero engine. The result was the Rolls-Royce Eagle, built with aluminium pistons instead of cast iron ones. (Side note: In 1919 a Vickers Vimy powered by two Rolls-Royce Eagle engines was the first aeroplane to make a non-stop trans-Atlantic crossing.) W.O. then visited Sunbeam resulting in their aero engines also being equipped with alloy pistons. Next, he went to Gwynnes who made French Clerget engines under license. The Clerget licensees were unwilling to implement Bentley's suggestions so the navy gave him a team to design his own aero engine at the Humber factory in Coventry. The result was the BR1 (Bentley Rotary 1) which ran successfully early in 1916. The larger BR2 followed in 1918.

In recognition for his achievements to the war effort, W.O. Bentley was awarded the MBE (Most Excellent Order of the British Empire). In addition, the Royal Commission on Awards to Inventors presented to him £8,000 acknowledging his many contributions.
