# BRITISHBOOTSANDBONNETS.COM TRAFFIC REPORT FOR 2021 JANUARY 2022

Greetings from your Webmaster,


This month's report is a recap of 'traffic' on the BBB website last year. Previously referred to as the BBB Traffic Report, here is a summary for 2021:

- According to our hosting service Squarespace, <u>britishbootsandbonnets.com</u> had 2,607 unique visitors and 3,060 total visits during 2021. BBB averaged 335 visits per month.
- Those visitors viewed 6,629 pages on our site, for an average of 552 page views/month.
- June and September were the busiest months with 604 and 576 visits respectively. February & December were the slowest, averaging 73 visits/month.
- Overall, traffic during 2021 was UP 86% when compared to the previous year. You may recall 2020 was extremely slow in terms of traffic to our website due in part to COVID related shutdowns so this return to normal traffic levels is great to see.
- The 5 most popular content areas on our site were the Events Calendars, Newsletters, Event Photos, Current Officers and About Us webpages.
- Technology-wise, and for the first time in my memory, more visitors used mobile devices than desktop computers. 49% of our visitors viewed our website on mobile devices, 44% used desktop computers, and 7% logged in on a tablet.
- Traffic navigation patterns remained relatively consistent. The most popular pages were unchanged from previous years and we saw the heaviest traffic during the spring and summer as in the past.

For 2021, a couple prospective new members found us via the website. Last year the website posted announcements on our home page about changes and cancellations to club related events due to COVID-19. We also added a videos page with links to clips involving British cars, how-to tips, and UK automotive history.

Please let me know if you have any questions, comments or feedback about the website and our club's web-based strategies. If you have not checked out the club's website recently, I encourage you to visit <a href="https://www.britishbootsandbonnets.com">www.britishbootsandbonnets.com</a> this winter. Future car and club related events for 2022 will be added to the monthly events calendar when available.

# SO WHATEVER HAPPENED TO RICK HAMAKER'S MORRIS MINOR? - PART 1

As many of you know, at the time of his passing Rick Hamaker had a project car in process – a 1967 Morris Minor Traveller (RHD). Several Club members have, in fact, helped Rick with this car over the years and are familiar with it. As you can see in the photos, it's a very attractive car.

The intent now is to find a new owner for the car.

Rick had purchased the car in 2009 from a gentleman in Oklahoma. At this point it had 127,000 miles on it and that is pretty much what it has on it now. Rick had worked on it over the course of the years and had finished a lot of the "heavy lifting" but unfortunately was never able to see it on the road. And since it is not now drive-able the sell-ability and market value are greatly diminished. If the car were finished, or at least driveable, it would be much easier to find a buyer.

I do have some experience with Morris Minor Travellers as I own a 1958 model so I thought that I would be as qualified as anyone to finish the build. I volunteered and Sandy agreed to let me work on it and to provide a progress report to Club membership.

Finding all the pieces has been a challenge. Parts were being stored throughout the house and garage. I've recovered most of them, but not all.

Based on conversations I had with Rick, when he was still able to work on it, I know that he was having trouble fitting the wood frame to the car. So that's where I started.

More to come in next month's Chronicle (in Part 2) hopefully showing further progress. As soon as I get the wood frame properly attached and the aluminum roof panel installed then I will take a look at the engine (rebuilt but never run). Last step will be the interior.











Biggest issue I found was that the steel "cab" was skewed, the "B" dimension shown is greater than "A". This forced the wood frame sides to be crooked. The big danger is that the aluminum roof panel that attaches to the wood will become distorted if the wood frame is not square.



And this is how I corrected for it. Sort of a poor-man's Porto-Power. "A" now equals "B". Now, when the wood frame is attached everything is square and in alignment.



When the wood is all in alignment, the rear doors fit perfectly.



Another issue I discovered was that the RH top wood frame cross-member was badly warped. Here again, the biggest concern is the fitment of the aluminum roof panel. I fabricated a new piece (lighter in color in the picture) from locally sourced Ash.

The LH rear fender fit easily to the frame but the RH fender took some creative clamping. I believe the RH fender was distorted, certainly the wood frame was fine. There was evidence of a lot of hammer/dolly work on the RH fender – perhaps that is why it is bent. Note that both fenders are attached to the wood using 1" galvanized lag screws. This is not how it was done at the factory but it is how everyone – even at the UK Morris Minor shops – is reattaching them now.

#### So we do know a little bit of the car's history...

Every vintage car has a story and this is what I have learned about Rick's car. I know all of this because one of the previous owners (from the UK) forwarded a bunch of it's service records and MOT's to the car's owner in Oklahoma in 2003.

The car is a 67 Traveller RHD originally sold in Nov 1967; the UK tags on the car - PFD 351F - are original. The buyer was a resident of Sedgley (West Midlands). I know this because one of the documents provided is the original "Passport to Service" booklet that came with the car. What's interesting is that the Dealer/Distributor box in this booklet is stamped "Morris Motors Employees Sale". I assume that this means that the buyer was an employee of Morris and he bought it directly from them. It's not clear how long this person owned the car but the booklet contains hand-written notes and service records up to 1982.

Then the paper trail jumps to Aug 1987 where service receipts and MOT's were provided. At that time the vehicle had 85,000 miles on it. In 1994 it had major repairs done to the wood and sheet metal at King Street Motor Services in Kent. The last service record was from 12/1997 when it passed it's MOT with 121,000 miles. The car was owned by the same person from 1987 to 2002. Based on a recent email communication from this owner, the car was sold in 2001/2002 because it was no longer legally drive-able (no MOT) and was being stored outside in the elements. He is the same person that put the RAC badge on the grill. It's not clear who it was sold to but

# DID - U - KNOW by Facia Nearside

By the end of WWI, 30-year-old W.O. Bentley was recognized as an accomplished inventor and engineer. In 1919 he founded Bentley Motors Limited in London, and with partners Frank Burgess from Humber and Harry Varley from Vauxhall he set about designing a superior 3 litre engine. The engine of course was a success, and the first production Bentley 3 litre automobile was delivered in 1921. W.O.'s motto was "to build a good car, a fast car, the best in class". This goal was achieved and soon Bentleys were earning widespread acclaim for their durability.

In 1922 a single 3L Bentley was entered in the Indianapolis 500 and it managed a respectable 13th place finish in the 27-car field. Later that year three of the five cars to finish in the Isle of Man tourist trophy were Bentleys. As this was the only team to finish, they received the Team Award thereby launching Bentley's reputation. Bentley followed this up by winning Le Mans in 1924, 1927, 1928, 1929, and 1930. Ettore Bugatti is quoted to have said that W.O. "made the fastest lorries in the world".

Despite great success and an excellent reputation Bentley, like so many other enterprises of the day, was totally caught out by the Great Depression. With Bentley Motors LTD in financial difficulties Woolf Barnato purchased the assets and became chairman. W.O stayed on and continued design work as Barnato's employee. The worldwide financial crisis continued to take its toll however and by July of 1931 Barnato's financial support had evaporated and Bentley Motors went into voluntary liquidation.

It was expected that aero engine builders Napier and Son would purchase the assets of Bentley Motors but arch rival Rolls-Royce was keen to eliminate the competition. Rolls-Royce agents posed as the British Equitable Central Trust to avoid alerting Napier and driving up the price. A last-minute bid by Rolls-Royce topped Napier's bid and on November 30, 1931 Bentley came under Rolls-Royce ownership. With the acquisition W.O.'s life took a turn for the worse. His wife divorced him and the takeover terms obligated him to work for Rolls-Royce from 1932-1935. Sadly, Rolls-Royce even sequestered him from the design team working on a new car bearing his own name. W.O. never worked on a Bentley again.

Once free of the court appointed obligation with Rolls-Royce, W.O. moved on to Lagonda. David Brown had just made arrangements to combine production with Aston Martin and it is said he then acquired Lagonda just to gain W.O. Bentley's engineering experience. W.O. did not disappoint. Soon a double overhead cam Lagonda straight-6 appeared in the new Aston Martin DB2. The power plant was a masterful success and important design details were later carried over to their V8s. Eventually W.O. moved on to Armstrong Siddeley. There he designed another twin-overhead cam 3 litre engine before retiring.

W.O. Bentley passed away August 13th, 1971 shortly before his 83rd birthday. Although married three times he had no children.

# **ORIGINS OF THE JAGUAR**

In 1922, two motorcycle enthusiasts, William Lyons and William Walmsley, created the Swallow Sidecar Company. The company began using its initials SS to manufacture motorcycle sidecars and ultimately SS-branded automobiles. In 1934, the company was renamed and rebranded as an auto manufacturer, and began operating under the name SS Cars Limited. Towards the end of World War II, the company changed its name to Jaguar Cars Limited to avoid the association of its initial's SS with Germany's Nazi party's military wing.
