DID - U - KNOW

Sydney Allard was a visionary. He was perhaps the first to come up with the idea of mating a large American engine with a light British chassis foreshadowing several famous cars which followed. In the early 1950's both Cobra designer Carroll Shelby and Corvette chief engineer Zora Arkus-Dunton drove Allards.

Allard became quite successful supplying the sports car starved U.S. market with exciting and competitive models. Cars were shipped engineless to the United States where the power plant was added per customer order, usually an engine from Buick, Cadillac, Chrysler, Ford or Oldsmobile. Alas, as good as the idea was, Allard did not put money into improving design. Within a few years chassis technology, which was developing rapidly, left them in the dust.

In a last ditch effort to save the company, Allard produced a lightweight fiberglass bodied three wheeled micro car called Clipper. Powered by a single cylinder, two stroke motorbike engine, it seated three adults on a bench seat and two children (who didn't mind getting wet) in optional dickey seats. The innovative and sophisticated idea was a dismal failure, and the 20 examples produced only accelerated the demise of once proud Allard.



A RARE OPPORTUNITY

It all started October 5, 1962. A little known Scottish actor sat down at a baccarat table across from.....a beautiful woman of course. When Sylvia Trench asked the gentleman his name the whole world was introduced to him at the same time as he answered her with three now famous words, "Bond, James Bond".

The idea of making that first movie about the exploits of a British secret agent was the brainchild of Cubby Broccoli. Shot in Jamaica, Dr. No, based on Ian Fleming's 1958 book of the same name, was a low budget endeavor which took only 21 months from start to release.

On location in Jamaica, when Bond needed a car the only suitable ride that could be located was a blue Sunbeam Alpine owned by one of the island's residents, Mrs. Jennifer Jackson. The car was rented from her for ten shillings a day, and the 1939 LaSalle hearse that chased it was hired from a Kingston funeral home.

In case you have been living on another planet for the last 53 years, times have changed. Her Majesty's agent has had many iconic cars over 24 films, certainly the most famous until now being a 1964 Aston Martin DB5 which first appeared in Goldfinger. Although Aston Martin has had a successful relationship with the film series ever since that time, they have really upped their game in the latest release, "Spectre". Previous Bond cars have been standard offerings with special "modifications" provided by Q branch. Now, for the first time, 007 has a bespoke vehicle built exclusively for him by Aston Martin, the DB10. Ten DB10s, which will be the total production run of this model, were hand built for the film. What is probably the only one that will ever be offered for private ownership is part of a charity auction that will take place just a few days from now in London. Not rare enough for you yet? Consider that seven of the ten were written-off during filming, one will be kept by Eon Productions and one will be retained by Aston Martin. The only remaining example which will be sold on February 18th is the one with Daniel Craig's fingerprints on the steering wheel!

The car is expected to bring over two million dollars which just might be the bargain of a lifetime. The 1964 DB5 from Goldfinger fetched well over \$4 million when it last changed hands in 2010. And that blue Sunbeam Alpine, Bond's first car? After filming it was returned to the owner in Jamaica and its whereabouts are unknown, which probably puts it in the category of priceless.



Black Ice & Cowboy Boots

There I was, stuck on level ground. I'd been trying, with no luck, for several minutes to rock the car out of its 1/4-inch deep groove. Two cowboys wandered past, no doubt spotted the California plate (MG LIVES ironically enough, even though without help the car would be stuck there until late spring), and asked if I needed a push. "Yes please." Apparently two pairs of cowboy boots possess greater tractive grip than one snow tire.

With my '67 MGB GT released from its prison of parking lot black ice, I scampered back to the safety of the folks' driveway and parked the car. Taking advantage of my college location in Oregon, spring break 1981 was to be my first ever solo trip to the family vacation spot in Ketchum, Idaho. The car and I had only just been introduced to black ice a couple days before, and the result then had been predictably undesirable.

I have had experience on icy roads, but it was limited to Mom's four-wheel drive Jeep Wagoneer, which never got stuck in a parking lot. The B, though equipped at the back with a pair of snow tires, had an open differential. In sunny SoCal, that meant a little wheel spin when stomping the gas out of a right hand turn. In an icy parking lot it meant one wheel drive and ignominy.

The cowboys likely had fun at home that evening, recounting the story of the kid from California who got stuck on level ground. If only they had known about my black ice pirouette a couple nights before. Under the heading "a little knowledge is dangerous," in those days my car was equipped with a thoroughly modern driving computer. It had cruise control, and temperature sensors, a blue LED display, and six thousand buttons. Driving across interstate 84, from Salem, Oregon, to Idaho, I had been carefully monitoring outside temperatures.


Cresting a hill, the display said it was a balmy 34 degrees. Imagine my surprise then, when tapping the brakes while heading down hill. Rather than slow down, the car went into a counterclockwise spin. Probably only one revolution later, though it felt like two, the car headed nose first into the divider...and stopped. no impacts, no other cars involved, nothing else to do but put her in reverse and hope it wasn't stuck. Fortunately, the median was unfrozen. I backed out between the steel posts, snow markers, which stood in silent testament to all the stuff I didn't hit before stopping.

It certainly wasn't funny at the time, but with hindsight, and no damage done, I can laugh about the things that went wrong on that trip. In an age of Gary Larson animal cartoons, one might even imagine a local heard of deer standing over on the side of the highway holding up scorecards. "Simple spins are low value, but missing all the road signs significantly ups the difficulty factor: 8.5."

In retrospect, I'm not sure if snow tires provided any real benefit, but chains aren't an option on a heavily loaded B with sagging springs. Another feature of that particular MGB was the intermittent windshield wipers, but being a steel dash car, it was easy enough to reach up underneath, wiggle the wires, and bring the system back to life.
