Rich Cannistra offered the following information regarding electric vehicles and testing:

A Road Range Test was conducted on 11 cars initially and now have tested a total of 15 vehicles to determine which electric cars provide the best value and performance. The testing program controlled such factors as battery charge and temperature, and tested on a closed course. The cars were metered for electricity usage, considering the following:

Miles per Kilowatt Hour, Price per Charging, and Cost per Mile.

The Number One winner was the Hyundai Kona Electric with 259 miles on one charge.

The Number Two winner was Jaguar with 253 miles; Number 3 was KIA E Nero; Number 4 was Tesla X with 233 miles and Number Five was Tesla S with 204 miles.

2019 FINANCIAL UPDATE

On January 24th, BBB officers met to review responsibilities and make plans for 2019. We welcomed newcomers to the board, Solveig Maschke (Vice President) and Charlie Gall (Secretary). We also developed a budget for 2019 after reviewing yearly financials and cash balances for 2013 through 2018. Based on that information, the board has decided to discontinue paying a portion of members' Christmas party meals as of 2019.

Some history: By 2008, the club had accumulated a healthy fund balance and board members decided that it was larger than necessary. Looking for a way to spend down some of the balance, encourage member participation, and benefit members, the board decided to subsidize members' meals at the annual Christmas party. From 2008 through 2010, the club paid \$5 of each person's meal cost and from 2011 through 2018, the club paid \$10 of each person's meal cost. The club's cash balance has now been reduced to an amount roughly equal to one year's expenses, which provides a cushion for cash flow and the unexpected. For 2019, the board has approved a balanced budget.

WEBMASTER REPORT FEBRUARY 2019

Here is an updated 'traffic report' from the BBB website for last year. Please let me know if you have any questions.

BBB had 2,340 visits to our website by 1,993 unique visitors during 2018 (up 28%) Those visitors viewed 6,226 pages (up 38%) The most popular pages visited were Events, Event Photos, Newsletters, Club Information, and BBB Members & Cars

Traffic averaged 195 visitors and 519 pageviews per month

The months with highest traffic were August (330), June (306), May (225), July (220), and September (211)

January and December were the slowest months with roughly 100 visitors each 64% of the visitors were working on desktop computers, and 35% on mobile devices 60% went direct to our site, 28% searched on Google to find us, and 12% came from other websites or used a different web browser Top referring websites (other websites with links to our web address) include Moss Motors, Iowa British Car Club, British Car Union, Triumphspitfire.com. and British Marque.com.

Thanks to everyone who contributed photos from drives/events, member cars, or submitted tech tips for posting. I appreciate the help and believe they help the site (and club) look dynamic, active, and updated.


DID - U - KNOW by Facía Nearside

By the mid-1930s it was becoming obvious that war was once again on the horizon. The British government realized expertise within the motor industry was the key to turning out the complex machines that would be needed for the war effort. In a bold and innovative plan to maximize this production capability, the Shadow Factory Programme was formed.

The term "shadow factory" had nothing to do with secrecy. It described duplicated facilities in the shadow of their similar motor industry operation and under direct control of the parent company. During the first phase of the project in 1936 & 37 new factories were built beside existing ones. This facilitated sharing manpower and knowledge as well as making use of existing supply networks. During the second phase in 1938 & 39 building locations were farther from existing industrial centers to reduce vulnerability.

In a move which seems counterintuitive, German dignitaries were actually given tours of the shadow factories before the war. This was intended to be a deterrent by showing how well the country was prepared against attack.

There was no doubt the Shadow Factory Programme was an important piece of the puzzle in winning the war. What might not be as obvious is the role it played in kick starting the British auto industry at war's end. Modern tools along with automated production had been key to realizing required goals for the war effort. Now this was all available in large modern facilities for automobile production. Although most shadow factories are long gone or converted to other uses, some still exist. The Solihull Shadow Factory, which built Bristol aircraft engines, is now the center of aluminium body technology for Land Rover, and the Castle Bromwich Aircraft Factory, which turned out thousands of Spitfires, now produces Jaguar Sports Cars.
