



DID - U - KNOW

With "LeMans 66" striking gold at the box office it seems fitting to take a closer look at this prestigious event. (The movie is called "Ford vs Ferrari" in the United States.) The postscript of this true story points out Ford is the only American car company to win the 24 hours of LeMans. Who then have been the big winners? Here is a bit of LeMans by the numbers.

The 24 hours of LeMans is the oldest active sports car endurance race. With only ten exceptions, it has been held annually since 1923. (DUK 2017/4) The track, Circuit de la Sarthe, is 8.5 miles long with one almost straight section, The Mulsanne Straight, 3.7 miles long. Speeds in this section reach 200 mph. In 2019, 61 cars started the race and drove a total of 88,794 miles in the 24 hours.

The most wins by nation (country where the car was built) are: Germany (34), United Kingdom (17), France (15), Italy (13), and the United States (4).

The most wins by constructor (company building the car) are: Porsche (19), Audi (13), Ferrari (9), Jaguar (7) and Bentley (6).

The most wins per driver and their citizenship are: Tom Kristensen (Danish) – 9, Jacky Ickx (Belgian) – 6, and with 5 wins each, Derek Bell (English), Frank Biela (German), and Emanuele Pirro (Italian).

Winning drivers per nation: United Kingdom (30), France (29), Germany (19), United States (12), and Italy (11).

Number of wins per type of tyre: Dunlop (34), Michelin (28), Goodyear (14), Englebert (5), and Firestone (3).

Some other statistics, in no particular order:

Unlike most races, the winner is the car which covers the greatest distance in 24 hours. This lead to an unexpected result in 1966 (see the film). All cars are required to have two seats, or at least the ability to accommodate a second seat. Originally there were no rules about the number of drivers per car and some drivers have driven the entire 24 hours solo. Now, at least 3 drivers per car are required. The race has been cancelled 10 times, in 1936 due to a labor action and from 1940 to 1948 due to World War II. Circuit de la Sarthe consists of both dedicated race track and public roads closed for the event. In early years, the race went through the town of LeMans, and in 1955 a car crashed into a crowd of spectators, killing 80 people. In 2006 Audi won with a diesel powered car and in 1991 Mazda won with a rotary engine car. Rotary engines were then banned! And finally, the 1967 LeMans was the first time a winning driver spraying champagne was shown on television. Dan Gurney was handed a magnum of champagne, which he shook and sprayed on Henry Ford II, Carroll Shelby, and their wives. Yes, Americans do have an odd sense of humor!

The race usually takes place the second weekend of June, starting at 15:00. Planning on going in 2020? The start will be on Saturday, June 13 at 16:00.


WEBMASTER REPORT – JANUARY 2020
