## Britishbootsandbonnets.com Traffic Report for 2020 January 2021

Greetings from your Webmaster,

This month's report is a recap of 'traffic' on the BBB website last year. Frequently referred to as the BBB traffic report, here is a summary for 2020:

- According to our hosting service
   Squarespace, <u>www.britishbootsandbonnets.com</u> had 1,254 unique visitors and 1,590 total visits during 2020, for an average of 104 visits per month.
- Those visitors viewed 4,279 webpages on our site, for an average of 356 page views/month.
- January and July were the busiest months with 188 and 218 visits respectively.
   November & December were the slowest, averaging 50 visits/month.
- Overall, traffic during 2020 was down 29% when compared to 2019.
- The 5 most popular content areas were the Events Calendars, Newsletters, Event Photos, BBB Members & Cars, and About Us webpages.
- Technology-wise, 58% of our visitors were on a desktop computer, 30% used a
  mobile device, and 12% viewed our site on a tablet. Interestingly, desktop
  computer use was up and mobile traffic was down perhaps due to folks staying
  home last year more due to Covid-19.
- Traffic patterns remained relatively consistent, the most popular pages were unchanged from 2019 and we saw the most traffic during the spring and summer as in the past.

For 2020, a couple new members found us via the website and joined BBB last year. Regalia had some sales and the website generated numerous email messages from visitors on a variety of topics. Starting last March, announcements about club related changes, cancellations, and updates due to COVID-19 related restrictions appeared on the website's home page.

Please let me know if you have any questions, comments or feedback about the website and our club's web-based strategies. For now, here are my recollections of Jim, from when I first met him and as we grew into good friends. The chance meeting with Jim impacted me significantly and changed my path forever.

I first met Jim in 2005 when Jim and Lynda had volunteered an experience for a Silent Auction to raise money to restore the stained-glass windows in the Roscoe Methodist Church. The experience was a ride in British Sports Cars to lunch at the Village Supper Club in Delavan, WI. I won the bid and Jim drove the Healey, with me as the passenger, and Lynda drove the B with Phyllis. We had a great time and I got to know Jim on the drive and as we talked during lunch. It was my first introduction to a BBB style Drive and Dine.

Fast forward to 2011 when I retired and found myself in need of something interesting to do. I decided to restore an MG Midget. Not knowing what can be done or how to do it, Jim really stepped up to the plate. He offered to help me through the process of finding a car and would help me restore it. (OK, maybe it was more Jim restoring it and I was helping.) This was typical of Jim's generosity and willingness to share his interests and talents. He was a great teacher and encouraged me when I would get frustrated. There wasn't anything that Jim wouldn't tackle. And he would do it with confidence in his ability to overcome anything.





During the restoration, Jim and I would go to lunch at Whiffletree or Crazy Times just about every day we worked on the car together. We enjoyed lunch together so we continued to get together for lunch every Tuesday once the car was completed. This tradition continued until the pandemic messed everything up.

It was through Jim that we became aware of British Boots and Bonnets. The social opportunities for couples was one of the reasons for wanting to own a British car. As a member of the Car Club, I got to see more of Jim's character. He was everyone's friend and willing to pitch in wherever needed to help with club events or someone's mechanical problems. He had a wealth of knowledge of British cars and of life in general. His smile was ever present, as was his dry sense of humor.

Maybe more than British cars, Jim loved to travel. We had the pleasure of joining him on two trips. In 2014 Jim invited us to join Lynda and himself to his beloved St. Maarten for a week. It was obvious why he loved to go there every year. Warm weather, beautiful beaches, and friendly people. We had a private guide (Jim) that took us all over the island, showing all of the sights that you could tell he genuinely loved. It was during this trip that Jim introduced Phyllis to what has become her go to cocktail, Mount Gay rum and orange juice.

In 2015 we joined Jim and Lynda on a River Cruise through France. We spent 3 days in Paris before the cruise, staying at an Airbnb. Here again, Jim's spirit of adventure was on display. We did and saw things that I don't think I would have ventured to do on my own. Wherever he went, it just seemed like he belonged there.



Jim was a dedicated family man and was proud to tell stories of his children, grandchildren, and the foreign exchange students that they had hosted. I smiled to myself every time he would mention Lynda, because she was never just Lynda or his wife. He always referred to her as "my bride".

We will miss Jim and the enthusiasm he brought to every situation. I will end this story with a saying that Jim used frequently and has become something that Phyllis and I now use often. When you would tell him an alternate solution or idea, he would think a minute and then say, "Well, there is that."





#### DID - U - KNOW

His Majesty's airship, the R100, was developed in the late 1920's to provide passenger and mail transport within the British Empire. Although government funded, the R100 was built by the Airship Guarantee Co. headed by Dennis Burney, a gifted aeronautical engineer and inventor.

### **HM Airship R100**



Burney had a keen interest in aerodynamics, and automobiles of the 1920's appeared stodgy to him so he decided to do something about it. In 1927 he established Streamline Cars LTD for the purpose of building advanced aerodynamic automobiles. Burney produced thirteen individual cars, each a unique design that was never intended for production. They were developed to showcase his patents and innovative ideas. In addition to their aerodynamic shape this included fared-in headlights, hydraulic brakes, independent suspensions, a spare wheel carried inside the rear door, and even a heater! The smooth aerodynamic body was capable of seating seven and it concluded at the rear with a Beverly-Barnes straight eight engine cantilevered out beyond the rear wheels.


Believing the Streamlines pointed the way to the future, Crossley Motors took out a license to build them in 1933. Unfortunately, the cars were expensive to manufacture, had unpredictable handling characteristics in wet weather, and proved too "different" to sell. Crossley wound up production of the model after 25 had been built.

None of the Burney Streamlines are known to survive, and only two of the Crossley Streamlines are thought to exist. One is at the National Motor Museum in Beulieu UK, the other is a private




It needs a REAL GOOD cleaning. The crud it has accumulated over 70 years is now mostly petrified.
















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## MG DRIVER SPOTLIGHTS NEW BRITISH BOOTS & BONNETS MEMBERS
