We were looking for the museum, and she politely exclaimed it was across the street. Apparently it was visitor hours and the guards assumed we were visiting prisoners. We were a little relieved when they let us go.

Going back to the beginning, there were only four of us on the drive: Charlie and Linda Gall, Dwain and Jenny Plymale. It was a little hot so I drove Peggy's air conditioned Jag and the others had to endure the heat.

First stop is Savannah for a pitstop and stretch. The bridge from Savannah to Sabula was new and quite handsome. Onward through the Rolling hills of Iowa which are quite nice. Second stop was the general store and restaurant in the countryside around Anamosa. Yelp gave them best reviews, but the food and the service were marginal, perhaps because they were very busy. I would give them a second chance because of the location on the river. Next stop the prison, but we ended up behind an outing of 100 tractors that can only go 15 mph, plus the distraction caused me to miss my turn (good excuse). Congratulations to Rich for this well-deserved recognition and for his selfless service to our country!






Llantwit Fardre is not a name which rolls off the tongue easily. Yet this small Welsh town just down the road from Church Village holds a unique place in automotive history: it was the location of the Gilbern Factory, the only production car to ever come from Wales.

The somewhat unlikely beginning was a direct result of WWII. Bernard Friese, who was born in Prussia, enlisted in the German Army as a teenager. While serving in the Netherlands he was taken prisoner by the Allies and interred in a POW camp in Kent, England. Upon being released after the war his father advised him there was nothing to return home to, so Friese stayed in England. There he worked for a coach builder making lorries and sports car bodies with a new material called glass fibre. In 1956 Friese moved south to Wales where he chanced to meet Giles Smith, the butcher in Church Village. The two men shared a love of sports cars and were excited by the possibilities of this revolutionary new material, fiberglass.

In a room behind the butcher shop the pair worked to turn their vision into reality. Both were determined to create a capable, high quality sports car. They formed the marque called Gilbern by combining their two first names. The first car was completed in 1959 and called the GT Mk1. It had an 1100cc Coventry Climax engine and Austin A35 suspension. When the car was finished a tree had to be cut down to get it out of the building! They were pleased with the prototype, and those who tested it thought it compared favorably to other sports cars of the day. Buoyed by this success the pair moved to larger premises and began production.

Various mechanical improvements followed and by 1966, with an MGB 1800cc engine, the car was renamed the Gilbern GT1800. "The Motor" tested this model and found it to have good manners and be capable of nearly 100 m.p.h. Next came the Gilbern Gene produced from 1966-1969 and powered by a Ford Essex V6 engine. Following this was Gilbern's most successful model, the Invader, with more than 600 built between 1969 and 1973. In one final attempt to keep up with the times, a wedge shaped Italian styled model called T11 debuted in 1973. However the company fell victim to the ongoing economic crisis and the T11 never went into production.

Total Gilbern output between 1959 and 1973 numbered more than 1000 cars. It is estimated in excess of 700 still exist, and today they are becoming highly sought after collectables. Giles Smith and Bernard Friese would no doubt be proud to know their creation in the back room of that Welsh butcher shop still excites the imagination of like-minded enthusiasts, and that they are responsible for what is so far the only production car from Wales.



FYI... DRYER SHEET

Carry a dryer sheet to keep yellow-jackets away.

Use them all the time when playing baseball and soccer. Use them when working outside. It really works. The insects just veer around you.

- 13. Clean baked-on foods from a cooking pan. Put a sheet in a pan, fill with water, let sit overnight, and sponge clean.
- 14. Eliminate odors in wastebaskets. Place a sheet at the bottom of the wastebasket.
- 15. Collect cat hair. Rubbing the area with a sheet will magnetically attract all the lose hairs.
- 16. Eliminate static electricity from Venetian blinds. Wipe the blinds with a sheet to prevent dust from resettling.
