

BBB Webmaster Report July 2020 - Is it Canceled or Cancelled?

Truth be told, your webmaster received an email recently from someone who had been viewing our website and wanted to let me know she noticed a spelling error. She pointed out I was consistently spelling the word 'canceled' incorrectly, it should only have one 'I'. My first reaction, I was thrilled I was being consistent. My second reaction, I thought it could be spelled either way. My third step, Google it. Here is one link from dictionary.com and there are many more sites with similar information:

Why are there two different spellings: canceled vs. cancelled? Spelling in the English language has historically been messy and inconsistent. Standardization really only took root in the past few centuries, with American and British English diverging in some significant ways along the way—thanks, in part, to two influential dictionaries. British English spellings have primarily followed spellings in Samuel Johnson's A Dictionary of the English Language, first published in 1755. American English spellings were shaped by Noah Webster's An American Dictionary of the English Language, first published in 1828. Webster was an advocate for many simplified spellings, including not doubling final, unstressed L's.

FYI, the word cancellation is correctly spelled with two 'i's on both sides of the pond. Since we are a British car club, your webmaster feels that British English spelling rules the day, and so double 'll's' is the proper choice. I plan to continue this practice going forward, and replied to the email with a simple thanks. What I really hope to see – no more cancelled events regardless of spelling, and a safe return to normal.

DID ~ U ~ KNOW

When William Richard Morris left school at the age of 15 he apprenticed to a bicycle repair shop. Almost a year later, when denied a raise, he set up his own bicycle repair business in his parents' back garden. This venture was successful enough to allow him to open a shop at 48 High Street in Oxford. Here he not only repaired bicycles but manufactured one of his own design called The Morris.

In 1901 he moved on to powered vehicles by designing and building the Morris Motor Cycle at his Oxford garage. Soon this also included selling, repairing, and hiring cars. Within ten years he had once again outgrown his current premises and made a move which this time also included a name change, becoming The Morris Garage.

In 1912, Morris designed his first car, The Morris Oxford "Bullnose". It was built almost entirely from outsourced components including engines and axles from the U.S.A. Morris wisely teamed up with an acquaintance who was an expert in flow production, Frank Woollard. Woollard pioneered production efficiency similar to what Henry Ford had accomplished with the assembly line. In 1923 Morris was producing 300 cars per week. Through Woollard's genius, by 1925 that number had increased to 2000 cars per week. With a quality product at a very affordable price Morris cornered 51% of home market automobile sales.

In 1927 William Morris bought the assets of Wolseley Motors Limited. At the time Wolseley were well into the development of an overhead camshaft 8hp car which Morris launched as the first Morris Minor in 1928. In 1929 he followed with the original MG Midget, based on the Minor's mechanicals.

William Richard Morris was known as "the most famous industrialist of his age". He was ennobled as Viscount Nuffield on New Year's Day 1938.
