


Jackie and Rich

NIAGARA FALLS TRIP

June 4th the Kuhnaus, Grosenicks and Cannistras launched off on an eleven day adventure centered around NAMBGR 2015 at Niagara Falls in Ontario, Canada. What follows is a brief synopsis of the fantastic trip that we enjoyed.



We began the journey by taking the high speed ferry across Lake Michigan. The Lake Express transports 40 cars from Milwaukee to Muskegon, Michigan in 2-1/2 hours. The crossing is less relaxed than the Badger but enjoyable all the same.

Once in Michigan it was about a 90 minute drive to our hotel near Hickory Corners. The second day was dedicated to the Gilmore Car Museum. The buildings, the grounds and the cars are all beautiful. A wide variety of automobiles and the history to go with them had something for everyone. As we were preparing to leave the museum, Packards started showing up from all directions. They were the featured marque for the show that weekend at Gilmore.

There was a lot to see and with only 1-1/2 days to cover it we were plenty busy. A highlight for the guys was touring the Ford Rouge F-150 plant while the gals enjoyed the Henry Ford Greenfield Village. Henry Ford had a broad vision. The ingenious inventor was so enamored with ingenuity that he began collecting innovations he felt represented the resourcefulness of everyday Americans. One of the wealthiest men in the world, Ford collected not art, but things. At one time, he attempted to acquire one of everything ever made in the United States. This museum is testament to the fact that he came close.



Monday morning we crossed into Canada and proceeded across southern Ontario to the Niagara Falls area. The hotel was in a relatively busy location but that gave many choices of restaurants and shopping. It was also only a short drive to view the falls. Tuesday was taken up with tech sessions and touring the local area. The nearby town of Niagara-On-The-Lake was beautiful, quaint and historical. An especially amazing location there was the Prince of Wales Hotel built in 1864. Nancy and Marna enjoyed traditional afternoon tea in this beautiful setting later in the week. The surrounding area is loaded with wineries, they must number into the hundreds. I believe we all felt it our duty to sample a wide variety of the local offerings.

Wednesday was the car show, which started with a drive that ended up at the show site, a large park called Balls Falls, out in the country. The threat of rain came true, but two brief showers did little to dampen the spirits of the participants. Beautiful weather followed allowing an enjoyable top down drive...to some more wineries, of course.





We ended the day with the amazing experience of watching an ocean going freighter "climb the mountain" on the Welland canal. Thursday was once again time for touring the local area capped off by the banquet in the evening. A dinner theater type location was the venue, and the evening started off with a magic show. None of us dreamed that there were so many ways to make a lady disappear. The awards presentation was especially exciting for Ron and Nancy Kuhnau as their green MGB was awarded first in class. Congratulations Ron and Nancy!



Friday morning we hit the road early, crossing back into the Unites States at Buffalo, NY and proceeding on to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland. This museum of sounds, clothes, records and history is more than a person can see in one day. We stayed until closing time and then took the van driver's advice, going to the Chop House in downtown Cleveland for dinner. It was noteworthy that after eating out the previous eight evenings, we all opted for prime rib this time. It turned out to be a good choice as everyone thought that it was the best that they ever had.

Saturday morning we were off to Auburn, Indiana for the last stop on our round robin tour, the Auburn, Cord, Duesenberg Automobile Museum. What started out in 1900 as the Auburn Automobile Factory and it's art deco showroom has been turned into a world class museum to showcase the three marques. The grandeur of this place and it's vehicles is simply amazing! Those of us with BBB tendencies did notice however, that two Jaguars snuck into the mix, even if it was in a small side room.



Sunday morning it was time to say our goodbyes as two MGBs headed for home and the Cannistras turned around and spent some time in Ohio visiting relatives. The tour plan had been a good one with interesting stops only a couple of hundred miles apart all along the way. Round trip was about 1500 miles with no mechanical issues of any type. Going to and from Canada was a breeze and best of all...the company was superb!

DID - U - KNOW by Facia Nearside

In 1871 William Banks Skinner married Jane Lilley, the daughter of successful shoe manufacturer Thomas Lilley. By 1881 Skinner became a partner in the business and the name changed to Lilley & Skinner, a brand that still exists today. Not only was Lilley & Skinner the largest shoe manufacturer in England, it was at one time the largest in the world.


Jane and William had five children. The two oldest boys, Herbert and Thomas, followed their father into the very successful family business.


This provided the means for them to become early adopters of an exciting new technology, the automobile. They bought a French car but were unhappy with the operation of the carburettor. The brothers came up with a better design, one with a bellows made out of fine shoe leather which of course they had in ample supply. Their method worked well and a patent for what they called the Union Carburettor was granted in 1906.

Before long however, the brothers fancied having their name on the product and changed the name to the Skinners Union Carburettor. From that day to this, most people simply know Herbert and Thomas' invention as the SU.
