

#### DID - U - KNOW

If you are one of those gearheads who can't leave well enough alone then perhaps you have heard of Bertone. They have made a business of customizing most anything on four wheels, and some things on only two. Their success has reached some amazingly diverse corners of the automotive industry, everything from Bentley to Volvo. So how did this legendary Italian firm carve out such a successful niche?

Giovanni Bertone started a carriage manufacturing business near Turin, Italy in 1912 although the company was forced to close during WWI. After the war Giovanni could see the hand writing on the wall. He left the carriage business in the rear view mirror and moved into the automotive sector. Most automobiles of the period were slow and boxy looking but Bertone had a different vision. He had an eye for style and soon developed a reputation for turning ordinary vehicles into visual masterpieces. Within two years he had contracts from two major Italian automotive companies to customize a portion of their production. Then Vincenzo Lancia realized Bertone's immense talent and commissioned him to create complete bodies for his car company.

These were exciting times in the automotive industry. Turin, Italy was recognized throughout the world as a center of excellence in the car industry, and Giovanni Bertone was sitting right in the center of it. Styling was rapidly evolving and Bertone was one of the driving forces. Despite difficult economic conditions in the early 30's, Giovanni Bertone's astute management allowed the company to prosper. In 1933 Nuccio, Giovanni's son, joined the business. Bertone moved to larger premises and added commercial vehicles to their portfolio. The outbreak of WWII showed this to be a shrewd move, as Bertone shifted to production of military vehicles.

Post war, Bertone was hard at work providing innovative styling for a car starved Italy. In the early 1950's, orders began coming in from around the world, then at the 1952 Turin Auto Show a chance meeting between Wacky Arnolt and Nuccio Bertone led to the Arnolt-MG. The British were about to show up on the shores of North America in a very unexpected way.

#### MALTA CLASSIC CAR MUSEUM

Malta, an archipelago in the Mediterranean Sea between Sicily and North Africa, is the world's 10<sup>th</sup> smallest country with an area of just 122 sq/mi. It was a British colony from 1813 until gaining its independence in 1964, finally becoming the Republic of Malta in 1974.

Following 151 years of British history, Malta has been left with many quaint bits of British influence including charming old hotels, food, language, driving on the left side, and of course cars. While visiting Malta in October we were pleased to visit the Malta Classic Car Museum. This well-appointed museum is the obsession of one petrol-head, Mr. Carol Galea. Although specializing in British cars of course, the museum also contains memorabilia, a research library, a cinema continuously showing documentaries about classic cars, and a complete restoration facility.
