OBSCURE AMERICANA

In August of 2021 Roxann and I visited a famous bronze age site on the Salisbury Plain in Wiltshire England. Known the world over I'm sure you have heard of it and longed for a visit. Well okay, it wasn't a bronze age site it was more of a gear-head age site. And as for the plain...it is the High Plains of Nebraska near Alliance. Famous? No, not that either. So, what is this not so well-known place? Carhenge, the creation of Jim Reinders.

Built far from the nearest interstate, Carhenge was conceived by Reinders as a monument to his father, and built for a family reunion in 1987. Reinders had lived in England for a time and became fascinated by the prehistoric British cultural icon Stonehenge. Constructed in a 96-foot diameter to match Stonehenge, Carhenge is made of 39 cars from the 1950s and 60s. The heel stone is a 1962 Cadillac and all the cars are spray painted flat gray to add to the realism.

Unfortunately for the Reinders family not everyone saw the monument as a work of Art. The residents of Alliance at first considered it unsightly and wanted to tear it down. Then farsighted officials at the Nebraska Dept. of Highways tried to classify it as a junkyard and erect a big fence to hide it. Fortunately, as time passed cooler heads prevailed and local citizens came to realize they had their own unique bit of Americana. A visitor's center was built and the attraction has appeared in film, popular music, television programs, and commercials as well as being the subject of a 2005 documentary "Carhenge: Genius or Junk?" Today as you approach the site, signs at the outskirts of town proudly proclaim "Alliance, home of Carhenge". Road trip anyone?





SO WHATEVER HAPPENED TO RICK HAMAKER'S MORRIS MINOR? PART 2

Work continues! We took a couple weeks off and went South to get warm but otherwise I've kept my head in the project.

A problem Rick discovered when attempting to fit the wood frame was that the "flanges" on the rear wheel arches were not in the correct position. Apparently there had been some remedial metal work done in this area at some point in time – but it wasn't done right. Anyway, Rick had trimmed away the forward-most 1/3 of both arches to allow the wood frame side pieces to fit up to the car. But the wood frame does rely on the flanges so once I had determined where the flanges should be located, I had to fabricate and weld

in some repairs.

Once arch flange repairs (plus the other chassis repairs I had to do — cab straightening) were done, the wood frame now sits nicely "square" on the chassis.



Next the rear doors were hung. This was a lot harder than I remember it being when I did my '58. The RH door wanted to mount higher than originally - or perhaps the holes in the new pillar were drilled too low? Either way it was a struggle, but now the doors swing properly and have reasonably even gaps.

Rick had planned on doing a "slatted" ceiling in the rear portion of the car. He had gone so far as to cut and varnish all of the slat pieces. I wanted to comply with that plan but once I got into the assembly process it wasn't clear exactly how he intended to do it. All of the slats appeared to be too short. To remedy this I added an "extension" to the rear cross-piece of the wood frame. Then slatting was added.





The aluminum roof panel has been trial fitted and everything is coming together nicely. Attaching the roof is the next item on the list. The roof panel is nailed to the wood frame.



Of course, once the roof panel is in place then comes what is probably the most stressful job on a Traveller - attaching the roof guttering. It's not that it's a difficult job, it's just that if you screw it up (even slightly) there is no remedy other than buying new pieces and starting all over. The molding comes in 7 ft lengths and ships from the U.K. - as in expensive shipping costs.

Once the guttering is on, it has to be painted the body color. This <u>should</u> <u>be</u> the only painting needed on the car; all the repairs/welding I've had to do get covered by upholstery. But any such painting will have to wait until later this Spring. And of course, there was no extra body paint left over so I will have to source new. In the mean time, work will press on.

I'm quite anxious to attempt starting the engine — with any luck by end of March?. It is a rebuilt 1275 cc (likely from a MG Midget) that I believe has never been run since the rebuild and has been sitting for several years. Should be interesting.



DID – U – KNOW by Facia Nearside

Born in 1870 Montague Stanley Napier became the owner of his grandfather's engineering company, D. Napier & Son, in 1895. At the time the firm produced machine tools for the cycle industry, but after meeting race car driver Selvyn Edge in 1899, Napier diversified into automobile manufacturing. By 1912 Napier was the leading supplier of luxury cars in Great Britain.

When the first world war broke out Napier were contracted to build aeroengines to designs from other companies. These engines proved to be unreliable however so Napier decided to design their own engine. Requiring high power output and low weight Napier's engineers designed a 12-cylinder 24-litre engine consisting of three banks of four cylinders sharing a common crankshaft. The engine was quite advanced for the time using four valves per cylinder with twin overhead camshafts. Named Lion the engine entered production in 1918. With an output of 450 horsepower, it was the most powerful Allied aircraft engine of the war.

Napier resumed automobile production after the war, but by 1925 decided to abandon that market and concentrate on aero engine production. At this same time automobile racing was becoming very popular and capabilities of the Napier Lion engine soon attracted the attention of wealthy racing driver John Rhodes Cobb. Following several wins driving a 10-litre Fiat Cobb was looking for more power, and the Napier Lion was a logical choice. He commissioned Reid Railton to design a car utilizing the monstrous aero engine, now in supercharged and highly tuned racing form producing more than 1300 horsepower. The result was the Napier-Railton, capable of reaching 168mph.

Next Cobb turned his attention to the land speed record. During the 1920s and 1930s the speed record was a constantly moving target as ever more powerful machines were constructed. Incredibly Cobb decided two Napier Lion engines was the way to go. The result was the Mobile Railton and Cobb drove it to a record 350mph in 1938 to become the fastest man on earth. The record was soon broken but Cobb recaptured it several more times. The final run for the twin Napier Lion powered Mobile Railton came in 1947 when Cobb drove it to an astounding 394mph.


