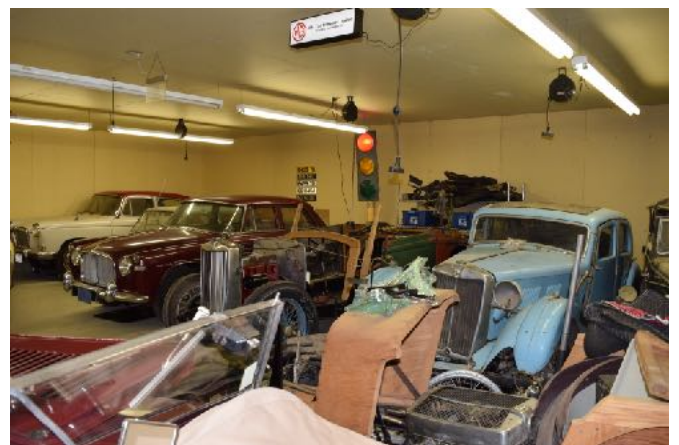
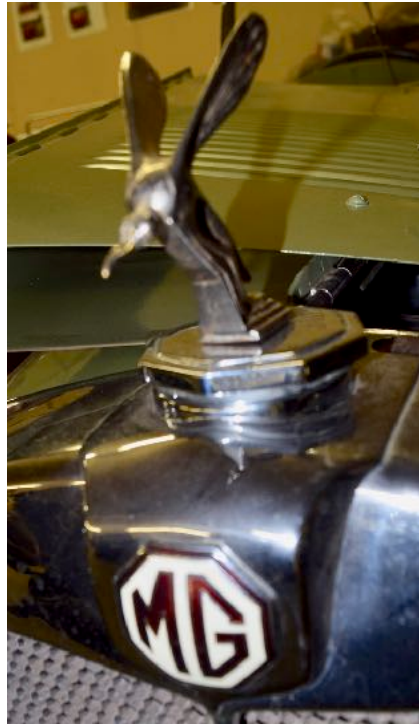
Dennis and Krystal provided a homemade lunch for all. The group was led on a tour of 3 barns full of MG's and other British car related memorabilia. One barn housed an active working shop for current restorations, projects, and equipment. A second barn held future projects, and a wood working shop. The third barn had (for the most part) finished cars and more. Below are some photos of some of the cars in the Klemm collection!

The Klemm collection mostly includes MG's from the 1930's, 40's and 50's; a couple 1100's, an MGA, an MGBGT, and more. Cars representing J-types, M-types, P-types, plus an MG SA Saloon and various Midgets, Magnas and Magnettes were here. A couple non-MG British cars were found including an old Plymouth and US Army jeep.

This list just highlights a portion of what Dennis has collected over many years.

Dee Gibson even had a chance to drive a military Mule following a brief training session: "Dennis told me (when I told him I had been in the Army) that the Jeep he had is one of 15 PROTOTYPES tested by the Army by various companies. His Jeep was designed and made by FORD! The U.S. Marine Corps Mile that I drove had been used to carry ammunition and supplies. They could also be stacked on top of each other for loading and transporting on ships."

THOUGHTS FROM HIS WIFE, JACKIE:

Let me tell you about Richard

We spent 57 years together; my very best friend and partner

We met at a Rag Dance (Sadie Hawkins) the annual end of year activities for Students at the Malvern Technical College.

He rode a triumph motorcycle, graduated to mini-van, next a Singer, Make? In his rain gear he loved to ride his motor cycle in storms and driving the 15 miles between our homes. He participated in hill climbs with both cars and motorcycles.

We always enjoyed driving, England is so historic, within an hour we found places to see and visit. The English pubs a favorite hangout, in 16th to 18th century buildings, warm fireplaces, beamed ceilings, small and cozy to sit and relax. People brought their dogs, spaniels, Great Danes, etc.

In his home village, his local Clanes Church and an 18th century pub situated next to the cemetery, we visited it again this past Spring. His school was next door.

Rich and pals loved traveling and camping in Spain. When we married, our honeymoon was camping on the Adriatic Sea in Yugoslavia. The army there had horse drawn carts for troop movement. It was a lovely country then.

Emigrating here November 1967 exciting—sailing on the Queen Elizabeth I, we arrived in New York, seeing the Statue of Liberty for the first time. Our first airplane flight was to Omaha, Nebraska—what a contrast from black and white historic villages to cornfields. Hired by Fairbanks Morse, all expenses paid, allowing us return travel within the year if we did not like it here.

Loved it, enjoyed the vastness, riding Puddle jumper planes to work on scales all over Nebraska, Iowa, S. Dakota. England 50 miles a long journey on winding narrow roads; 500 miles to Chicago, Kansas or Denver a new experience.

In an apartment 4 months, by Spring Rich needed an outlet, bought a pop-up camper. We camped at local lakes, spent lots of weekends at Lewis and Clark Lake, S. Dakota. First wanted to see the Grand Canyon, next the Everglades, traveled continually.

We have very rarely had a serious dispute—one evening after work I was going to the Laundromat, being niggly that night, I dumped his laundry out, became contrite, however, when I got back he had not even noticed. What does he say “that’s alright you can do it next time” took the wind out of my sails.

Rich had a true art of accepting what is and not worrying about stuff you cannot change. We bought our first home in March 69. Rich visited building sites at weekends, viewing how homes were constructed—so different here compared to England—wood as apposed to solid brick inner walls. He loved learning new concepts how to do something. Busy all the time. Flower gardening not successful, succumbed to evergreens as all the neighbors did.

His good friend Bob educated him on USA football and baseball—double header July 4th, Rich would go to parades for Julie and other kids, with no plan to watch baseball!! The Parade, afternoon cookout, a few beers, went to the baseball game and fireworks. Bob loved Rich’s accent, loved his different expressions and introduced him to cooking on outdoor grills. One night/early morning they decided to cook steaks on the grill. Put them on when still partially frozen, once eating Bob said. “Rich they are a bit rare”, for years after they would laugh like loons recalling the time.

Fairbanks wanted to open the Canadian Market; they sent Richard as the manager. But the dollar to dollar exchange rate was not conducive to the promotion and expense. Stayed there 8 months, we loved Toronto—being able to take the train/tube, bus, walk on Young Street, most anywhere actually. After 3 years Fairbanks closed their operations. We had not moved fortunately.

In 1974 came to Roscoe, IL hired by Midwest Scale. Great people there! Rich learnt a lot and was introduced to electronic scales, a new challenge for him. He managed Cream City Scale, for a few years in South Beloit until bought out by investors.

After Rich left, he partnered with another 1-man scale company, extremely happy with his accomplishments. We lived on five acres with the house having south facing windows with a view of the landscape, the trees, a creek at the back, a haven for wildlife. He really loved our house with his workshop, such a relaxing work concept for Rich. He had disciplined work ethic with walking to the shop at 7:30 each morning. All his life—working was his joy. We shared the work together, home projects, window cleaning, yard work whatever. It was a great location for Julie and the grandkids, exploring, falling in the creek of course - Entertainment, barbecues, hayrides, dinner parties, lots of activities.

Active in New American theatre, we loved to go to the shows in Chicago, did not see Hamilton though. We enjoyed many concerts including Sarah Brightman/Michael Crawford, Elton John, the Rolling Stones, and going to Jazz festivals, we really did a lot over the years.

25 odd years ago Rich bought an MGA kit car. Never finished it. He bought a 1978 MG. Loved that car, still driving it last week. Great drives with British Boots & Bonnet Car Club. Purchased a Jaguar S-type, followed by his pride and joy, his blue XKR Jaguar.

The condo in Estero, Florida our Golden pond to retire. Golfing, beaches, visiting the Keys, Theatre, League sports training camps, etc. exotic bird life, Rich content for 2-3 weeks, restless back home for a few weeks.

Being alone will be raw, our life together has provided wonderful memories.

DID-U-KNOW

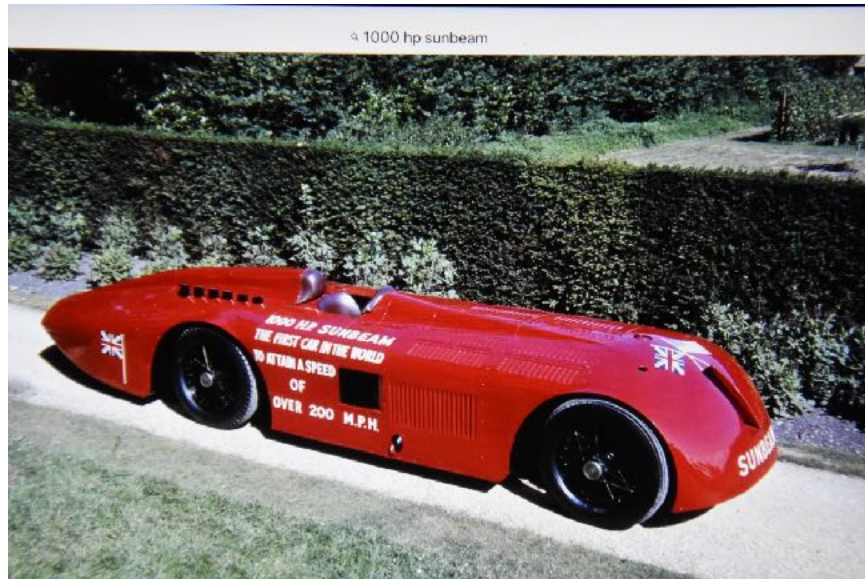
The Segrave Trophy is an award given to a British national who demonstrates “outstanding skill, courage, and initiative on land, water, or in the air”. The trophy is named in honour of Sir Henry Segrave, the first person to hold both land and water speed records simultaneously. Initially presented in 1930 the trophy is normally awarded annually, although it was not given during WWII and there have been 15 years when no achievement was deemed worthy. In the 89 years since its inception there have been 51 recipients. So who was this chap for whom the trophy is named?

Henry O’Neal de Hane Segrave was born in Baltimore, Maryland in 1896. He had an American mother, an Irish Father, was raised in Ireland, and went to university in England. In 1916 he joined the Royal Flying Corps serving as a fighter pilot in WWI.

At the conclusion of the war Segrave developed a keen interest in the new world of motorsport. In 1921 he won the first long distance race to be held in Britain, driving a Talbot-Darracq to victory at Brooklands. Then in 1923 he claimed victory in the French Grand Prix driving a Sunbeam. This made him the first Brit to win a Grand Prix in a British car. Following two more Grand Prix wins, Segrave turned his attention to speed records.

In 1926 he set his first record, clocking 152 mph at Southport, England. This speed was soon bested, but a year later Segrave became the first person to travel over 200 mph on land, recording 203.79 mph at Daytona Beach driving a 1000hp Sunbeam. He improved upon that one more time in 1929 recording 231.45 mph.





Segrave had also begun racing motorboats in 1927 and he won the international championship in 1928. He was knighted for his many accomplishments, then set his sights on the water speed record, designing and building a boat named Miss England. The boat, powered by a 12-cylinder Napier Lion aircraft engine, set a record of 98.8 mph, making him the first person to hold both land and water speed records simultaneously.

Unfortunately the joy of that accomplishment was very short lived. Following the record breaking run on Lake Windermere, Segrave went out to make one more attempt at improving upon it. The boat went out of control killing both Segrave and his chief engineer. The date: Friday July 13, 1930. Sir Henry Segrave was 33.
