Below you will find the proposed revision to the BBB by-laws. The board recommends that the motion to approve this change stipulates that this revision be effective January, 2018.

A State of Illinois Corporation

Proposed Revision

Adding Regalia Chairperson to the Exemption from the maximum consecutive term limits stipulation.

New items in Italic and underlined

ARTICLE V - BOARD MEMBERS (OFFICERS) AND ELECTIONS

Section 3 - An individual can only be elected to the same office for not more than two (2) consecutive terms. The offices of Newsletter Editor, Membership Chairperson and Webmaster and <u>Regalia Chairperson</u> are exempt from the maximum consecutive term stipulation.




WEBMASTER REPORT

DID - U - KNOW

Scottish marine engineer Alexander Wilson began business in 1857 as Alexander Wilson & Co. Engineers, manufacturers of marine pumps and other mechanical items. In 1897 the company name changed to Vauxhall Iron Works Co. LTD, and production soon expanded to include a one cylinder petrol marine engine. In 1902 this engine also became the basis for their first motor car. By 1905 larger premises were needed so the Vauxhall suburb of London was abandoned for a larger location at Luton and the name changed once again, becoming Vauxhall Motors.

Fortune smiled upon the young company in 1908 when a 24 year old draughtsman named Laurence Pomeroy designed an engine which was so successful it gave Vauxhall's superior performance to everything in their class. Sporting models became known for their racing success and posh saloons were favorites of the wealthy and famous. Production continued during WWI with staff cars for British forces.

After the armistice in 1918 Vauxhall found the landscape had changed. The expensive pre-war cars were no longer in demand causing profits to dwindle. Finally in 1925 Vauxhall was acquired by General Motors Corp. Slowly over the next several years, production was shifted from luxury and sports cars to small family cars, lorries, buses, and even tanks during WWII. This successful formula continued after the war, expanding into Germany in the 1960s with the Opel Kadett.

In 1967 Vauxhall became a Royal Warrant Holder, a motor vehicle manufacturer to HM The Queen. Continuing success then brought expansion into the United States with Chevette and Cavalier. In 1994 the company was once again honored with the warrant of HRH The Prince of Wales. Now, more than 100 years on, Vauxhall is the second largest selling brand in the UK and has been for the last two decades. The philosophy of providing a quality product at a fair price has obviously stood the test of time. Perhaps they took their cue early on from another giant in the auto industry, William Lyons. His success at the helm of Jaguar was centered around the philosophy that: "For every person who will open their purse to buy a sporting car, 99 will open their purse to buy a saloon."


