

DID - U - KNOW by Facia Nearside

While contraptions loosely called bicycles can be traced back to the early part of the 19th century it took until 1885 for John Starly to perfect the "safety bicycle". His bicycle overcame the shortcomings of most previous designs and was not unlike what we call a bicycle today. As fate would have it this was the same time the automobile was invented. Carl Benz patented his Motor Car No. 1 in January of 1886. With bicycles rapidly becoming all the rage, and powered transportation taking shape it was inevitable someone would put the two ideas together and come up with the motorcycle. Credit this time goes to Gottlieb Daimler for the "Daimler Reitwagen" which his son rode for the first time in, you guessed it, 1885.

It would seem with these three conveyances the field was complete, but then two Englishmen stepped up to the plate. Edwin Perks and Frank Birch decided to put the engine <u>inside</u> the bicycle wheel. They called their invention the "Motor-Wheel", and although unconventional it was actually quite successful. The entire 208cc 4 stroke engine and petrol tank were placed inside an 8 spoke aluminium wheel. The beauty of it was this wheel could replace a wheel on most any bicycle or tricycle turning it into a powered conveyance. The Singer Cycle Company was so impressed they began motor vehicle production in 1901 by purchasing the manufacturing rights to the Perks & Birch Motor-Wheel. Singer even added an additional fuel tank to increase range.

Although the motor-wheel remained popular for a relatively short time the British had one more go at it some 50 years later. Following WWII Brits were eager to get motorized, but petrol was still rationed and wages were low. BSA was selling conventional bicycles, but took note of what the competition was doing and decided to move into the motorized bicycle business. Debuting in 1953 the BSA "Winged Wheel" was a 35cc, 2 stroke, one horsepower engine which was an integral part of the rear wheel. The engine sat outside of the wheel this time but as before this wheel could replace the rear wheel on most standard bicycles. In production from 1953-1957 BSA produced more than 29,000 Winged Wheels although only a few hundred are known to survive today.
