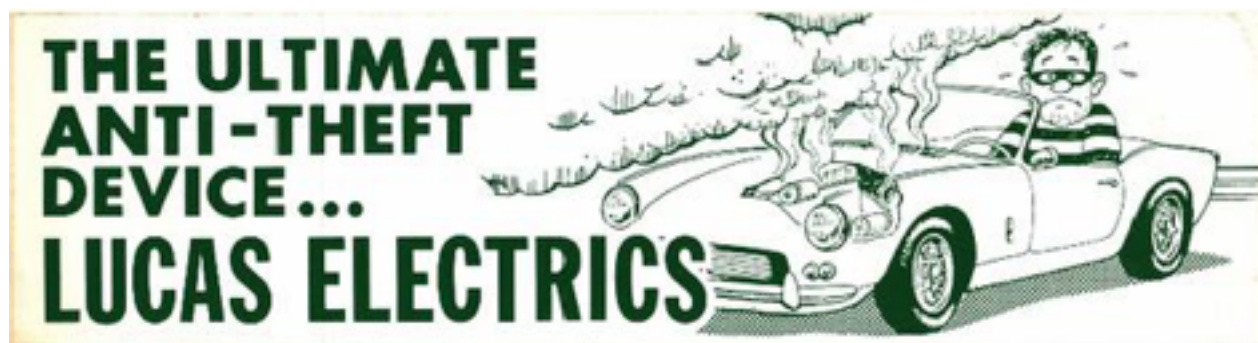

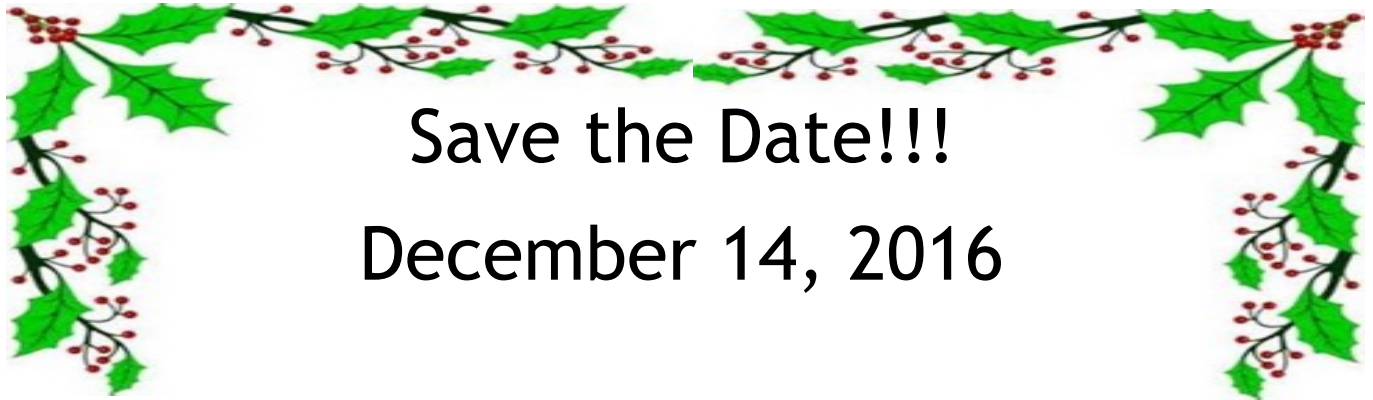

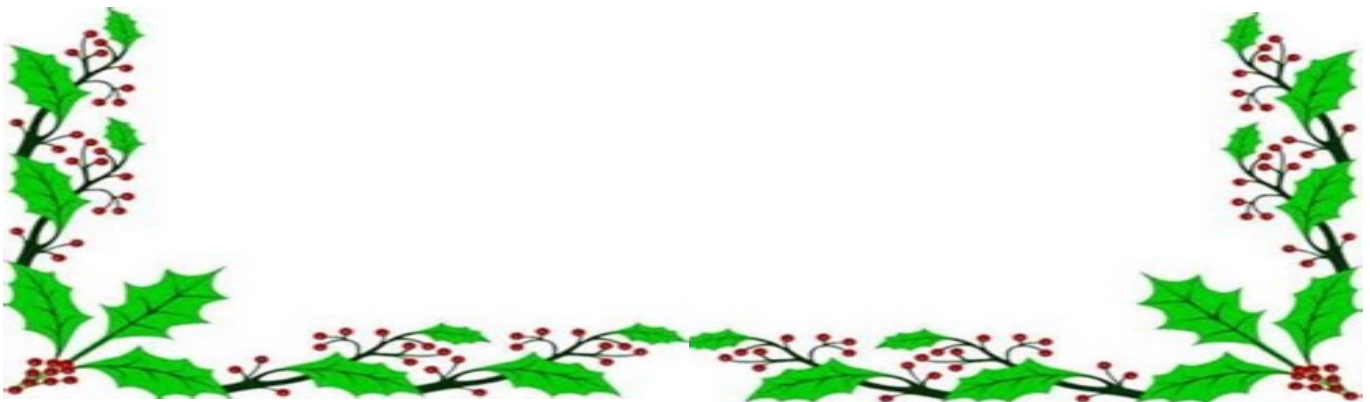

DID - U - KNOW

Although Velar is not a name that rolls right off the tongue it should be. In today's world of upscale all wheel drive vehicles, "SUVs" seem to dominate the market, especially across the pond in the USA. But where did the Yanks find this vehicle that seems to fill American driveways? Right here in Solihull! As you probably remember, the Rover Company produced a two wheel drive estate car in the 1950s called Road Rover. By the mid 50s Rover was experimenting with the idea of enlarging and expanding the capability of this vehicle. Other projects caused this to be shelved in 1958 however. When it was resurrected by two Rover engineers in 1966 they knew they were on to something. But in the highly competitive automobile industry it must be kept a secret, so they code named it Velar. Six hand built prototypes were finished by August 1969, a pre launch vehicle rolled out in June of 1970 and the public debut occurred in September 1970. The world's first SUV, the Land Rover had been born!

And what about that name Velar? It comes from the Italian "velare" meaning to veil or cover. Perhaps our Rover Company will still have the last laugh as today the Land Rover series of vehicles virtually covers the world.


