





A huge shout out to all who helped take the two club tents and signage down - especially to Nora (the Cannistra's granddaughter) who gathered up the pool noodle tent stake protectors. 

In the early 1920s the Austin Motor Company was basking in the success of one of the most popular economy cars the British market has ever known, the Austin Seven. (DUK2014/9) Fueled by this accomplishment Herbert Austin licensed the car for manufacture in several other countries including the United States. Investors stepped forward and the American Austin Car Company was founded in Butler, Pennsylvania in 1929.

The car was first shown to the public at the 1930 National Automobile Show in New York. Within a week an incredible 52,000 orders had been received. The tiny manufacturing plant in Pennsylvania was incapable of production anywhere approaching that number, but did build 8,500 cars in 1930. Unfortunately the backlog of orders soon became a moot point as the Great Depression cast

a pall over the nation. By 1932 the factory was closed. That should have been the end, but automobile dealer Roy Evans organized several investors and acquired the factory. Production resumed but the depression was far too widespread and demand stayed soft. By the end of 1934 dwindling sales caused the investors to pull out and once again the factory was shuttered. In five years of operation less than 20,000 cars had been built.

Ever optimistic, Evans reorganized in 1936 as the American Bantam Car Company. Production again resumed, but optimism is hard to take to the bank. During the next two years Bantam produced 6,700 cars and lost \$75 on every vehicle they made! Again they were on the brink of closure. For Roy Evans luck was about to change however, and in a very unexpected way.

Early in 1940 the U.S. Army was looking for a 1/4 ton, four-wheel-drive military vehicle. The army solicited bids from 135 automakers but only three responded: Bantam, Ford, and Willys. Bantam was the first to deliver a prototype in September of 1940, a vehicle they called the Bantam Ford. Car (BRC). The army was pleased with this design and Bantam was awarded a contract for the first 2,675 vehicles, with more than half of that production going to the



British Army. Ultimately, as world events intensified the government felt Bantam did not have the facilities to build vehicles in the quantity required so subsequent production went to Willys and Ford.

In 1943 when Willys advertised they had created the Jeep, the fair trade commission found them guilty of false advertising stating: "The Jeep was fostered and conceived in Butler Pennsylvania by the American Bantam Car Company."

Today's four-wheel-drive vehicles are recognized as direct descendants of that BRC "Jeep".





TECH TIP - REPRINT FROM 2008

This tech tip probably is not as useful for our LBCs as it is for our daily drivers. This tip I read about several years ago in the column "Car Talk" with Click & Clack, the Tappet Brothers.

There is always a blind spot toward the rear of your car when you drive, and some fool is generally driving in it. The way you adjust your side view mirror can greatly reduce that blind spot. Most of us, when we were taught to drive, adjusted the mirror so that we could see the rear corners of our car. In the article one of the brothers mentioned that he had been driving about 50 years and the corner of his car had never moved. (Mine hasn't either!) So he really didn't need to keep his mirror trained there. Here is the suggestion that they had.

You adjust your left side view mirror while driving in the right hand lane by moving the outside edge out so that as a car in the other lane disappears from your rear view mirror, you look in your left side view mirror and see the vehicle. It will remain visible in that mirror until you see it in your peripheral vision beside your car. You then drive in the left lane and adjust the right side view mirror so that the cars driving in the right lane are seen similarly. This effectively gives you 180 degrees of vision to the rear and sides of your car.

After you have adjusted your mirrors it takes a little while to get used to not seeing the side of your car in your side view mirrors. However, removing that blind spot makes changing lanes much more comfortable and safer. So hang in there until you get used to it.
