The site has several new features. 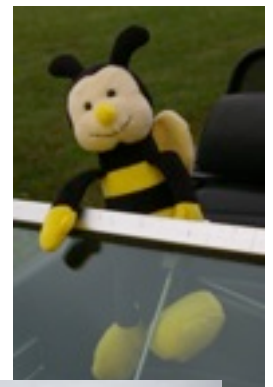

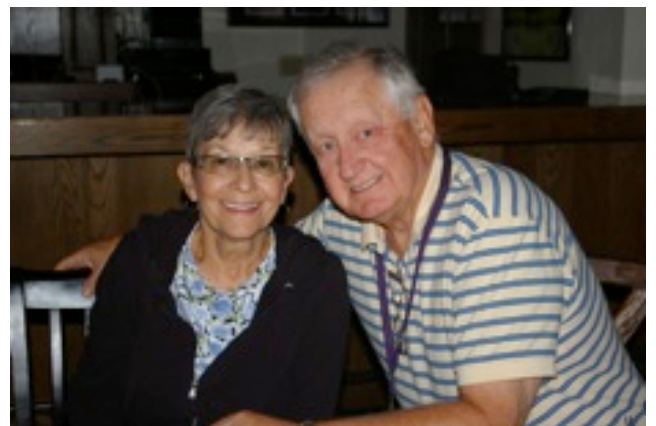
The brewery proved to have a wide variety of very fairly priced offerings leaving our crowd quite satisfied and looking forward to a possible return visit.
