DID - U - KNOW

Geoffrey Taylor liked the sound of the word Alberta, as in Alberta Canada. In 1929, when the 27-year-old began building cars, he chose a contraction of that name for them: Alta. Taylor was a hands-on engineer, and he began by making parts of the car on his own kitchen table. He then went on to build his own 1.1 litre engine with an aluminum block and shaft driven twin overhead camshafts. With the engine finalized he turned to designing the remainder of the car.

The Alta Car and Engineering Company set up operations in Surrey England, which today is a part of greater London. The 1.1 L engine powered the first thirteen cars before capacity was increased to 1.5L and 2.0 L. The cars became popular among club racers and sold steadily because they could easily be converted from 1.5 L to 2.0 L and back. This allowed drivers to contest more than one class without buying a second car.

In 1934 Taylor designed his first Alta to be intended purely for competition. The single seat voiturette (small car) developed quite a reputation in hill-climbs, time-trials, and sprints. Based upon this competition success Taylor continued to improve upon the design. In 1939 a third generation voiturette with a straight 8 and fully independent suspension was nearing completion when war was declared halting production.





During WWII, the firm manufactured aeroplane components. After the war a 2 litre Alta saloon was offered, but road cars never really interested Geoffrey Taylor. In 1945 Alta developed the engine for an Alta GP model using a revolutionary Meehanite block casting. Unfortunately, it proved to be quite troublesome due to two stage supercharging, however the HWM Formula 2 team used it with good success when running unblown.

In 1951 Alta produced their own Formula 2 car using their GP chassis. In 1954 the car was further developed to $2\frac{1}{2}$ litres for Formula 1 but was never used in competition. The engine went on to be quite successful, however. In 1955 it powered Tony Brooks to the first all British Grand Prix win since Henry Seagrave in 1923.

Of the many marques of Britain sports cars in the 1920s and 30s Alta developed a solid reputation for producing some of the most fun, high-performance cars available. Geoffrey Taylor died in 1966. His son attempted to revive the Alta name but was unsuccessful. Few of the pre-war sports models and single seat competition models survive and they always draw an admiring crowd when they show up at historic races or the Goodwood revival.

My First British Car Bruce Beneditz

The story begins 47 years before buying a British Car. As a teenager I was a big fan of all things racing, especially sports cars. I subscribed to Road & Track and Car & Driver magazines. At that time, I was a big Formula 1 and CanAm fan.

I shared this passion with my friend Stewart. We built slot cars and raced them weekly at a local hobby shop. Stewart and I rode our bikes everywhere and when we were 15, we found ourselves at the local MG dealership in Schofield, WI. The only car on the floor was a 1965 MG Midget. It was the closest thing to a race car that I had seen. There was no one else in the store and the salesman let us sit in it. I sat there and went through the gears like I was racing it. I was a lover of small sports cars from that moment on.

Fast forward to 2011. I retired and was looking for something to do. When I was single, I purchased and restored a 1969 Datsun 1600. (A Japanese copy of an MGB.) I began thinking about doing that again. I was good friends with Jim Vickery and admired his British cars. Through Jim, I also became aware of British Boots and Bonnets. I liked that BBB was a social group with a common interest in British cars. It was not just a car club.

It may have been to Jim's regret, but he offered to help me pick out a car and restore it. I decided to look for a Mark III Midget made between 1966 and 1972. The requirements were that it must have a 1275 motor and it did not have round wheel arches.

The idea filled three needs.

- I would have the small sports car that I fell in love with in the 60's.
- 2. I would have a project to begin my retirement.
- Phyllis and I would join British Boots and Bonnets and have a new social opportunity to fill our time.

So, the story begins with me finding a basket case of a 1970 MG Midget in Wisconsin. I took many pictures of it and consulted with Jim. He said go for it and I bought it. Some of the parts literally did come in bushel baskets.

You can tell by Phyllis' body language in the first picture that she was not thrilled with the choice.





It took at least 17 body panels from British Motor Heritage and countless other fabricated parts to get all the rust and bent panels fixed.





When the body work was done, it got painted in my garage.





I was very pleased with the result. It is not a show car. But it sure is fun to drive. A lot better that just sitting in that Midget at the MG Showroom in 1965.
