
# DID - U - KNOW

Most people would be content to design one automobile and have it successfully go into production. Noel Campbell Macklin was not "most people". Driven by an inexhaustible reserve of ideas, and the ambition to bring them to fruition, Macklin became an innovative and driving force early in the British auto industry.

Although born in Western Australia Macklin grew up in Wimbledon, just outside London. Educated at Eaton College and successful in amateur ice hockey, Macklin gravitated toward speedier endeavors and was racing at Brooklands by 1909. Foreshadowing later success by Allard, AC Cobra, and the Sunbeam Tiger, Macklin created the Eric-Campbell in 1919. The car used a Coventry-Simplex engine, Moss gearbox, and Rolls-Royce radiator. An estimated 500 cars were produced between 1919 and 1924.

In 1920 Macklin moved on founding Silver Hawk Motors of Cobham, Surrey, England. Again using "brought-in" components the Silver Hawk was a stylish high performance sporting design. Lack of backing meant the design was short lived however, with only about 12 cars made.



In 1925 Macklin joined with Oliver Lyle of the Tate & Lyle sugar empire to form Invicta (DUK2015/4). Except for the war years ample financing allowed Invicta to produce a wide and successful range of models from 1925 to 1950. Again, a variety of engines and other components mated to custom coachwork was a formula for success.



Macklin sold his interest in
Invicta in 1933 and Railton
became his next marque. The
first cars were made by fitting a
British body to a Hudson 8cylinder chassis. In 1935 the
Railton 8 claimed to be the
fastest production car in the
world, with a 0-60 time of 8.8
seconds. Railton produced a
wide variety of low volume
models until war halted

production in 1939. Turning his attention to watercraft Macklin then founded Fairmile Marine, and supplied boats to the Royal Navy throughout WWII.

For service to his country through Fairmile Marine, Sir Noel Campbell Macklin was honored with knighthood following the war. He passed away in 1946.

#### **NATIONAL ODOMETER DAY**



National Odometer Day on May 12th each year provides an opportunity to learn a little bit about the odometer.

And they're absolutely right. It is a chance to learn about the odometer and that's exactly what I did when it mentioned later in the article that it was invented in Beloit, Wisconsin.

Arthur P. and Charles H. Warner of Beloit, Wisconsin developed the first odometer for the automobile which appeared in 1903 and was patented as the Aturo-Meter.

I did a little more digging and it turns out that the Warner brothers (no relation, I think) invented more than just the odometer. According to the Henry Ford Museum website, they are also responsible for a much more important instrument, the speedometer:



Brothers Arthur and Charles Warner developed their "auto-meter," or speedometer, in the early years of the 1900s. Speedometers in these first automotive days were optional equipment.

There's no "Speedometer" Day so thankfully "Odometer" Day was here to educate us all.

# FIRST CROSS COUNTRY TRIP BY AUTOMOBILE

Dr. Horatio Nelson Jackson, in addition to being a physician, was an auto enthusiast who differed with the then-prevailing wisdom that the automobile was a passing fad and a recreational plaything. While in San Francisco's University Club as a guest on May 18, 1903, he agreed to a \$50 wager (equivalent to \$1,423 in 2019<sup>[3]</sup>) to prove that a four-wheeled machine could be driven across the country. He accepted even though at age 31 he did not own a car, had practically no experience driving, and had no maps to follow. Jackson and his wife planned to return to their Burlington, Vermont, home in a few days, and both had been taking automobile driving lessons while in San Francisco. She returned home by train, allowing him to take his adventure by automobile.

Having no mechanical experience, Jackson convinced a young mechanic and chauffeur, Sewall K. Crocker, to serve as his travel companion, mechanic, and backup driver. Crocker suggested that Jackson buy a <u>Winton</u> car. He bought a slightly used, two-cylinder, [4] 20 hp[5] Winton, which he named the *Vermont*, after his home state, bade his wife goodbye, and left San Francisco on May 23, carrying coats, rubber protective suits, sleeping bags, blankets, canteens, a water bag, an axe, a shovel, a telescope, tools, spare parts, a block and tackle, cans for extra gasoline and oil, a Kodak camera, a rifle, a shotgun, and pistols.<sup>[6]</sup>

Somewhere near Caldwell, Idaho, Jackson and Crocker obtained a dog, a Pit Bull named Bud. [8] As it turns out, Jackson had wanted a dog companion since Sacramento. [6] Newspapers at the time gave a variety of stories of how Bud was acquired, including that he was stolen; in a letter to his wife, Nelson said a man sold him the dog for \$15[9] (equivalent to \$427 in 2019[3]). It turned out that the dusty alkali flats the travelers encountered would bother Bud's eyes so much (the *Vermont* had neither a roof nor windshield) that Jackson eventually fitted him with a pair of goggles.


