

WHAT'S IN A NAME, PART 3: In 2011 Volkswagen unveiled its newest "city car", the "Up". Designed in Brazil, it was built in Slovakia and launched in Germany. As part of Volkswagen's New Small Family of models the Up is...well, small! A sloping front end followed by two doors and a rear hatch sums it Up. Powered by about anything that would fit in a breadbox those options range from a 1.0L petrol engine to a permanent magnet electric motor and everything in between.

The real fun however seems to be in the name, a fact not lost upon the presenters of Top Gear here in the UK. Our British models include the Take Up, Move Up, High Up, Black and Up, and White and Up. Elsewhere, when natural gas powered it's the Eco Up, and a four door model is the Cross Up. The electric version naturally enough is the E-Up and a VW bus looking offering with solar panels on the roof is the Space Up. A soon to be released hybrid will be the Blue Up. Finally, a compact version (is that possible?!?) with a two cylinder diesel engine is the Lite Up.

Perhaps what Volkswagen really needs is the Shape Up in order to Wrap Up their recent diesel fiasco and Cover Up!

Greetings all,

I thought it was time for another website "traffic report" as we start to think about spring and getting back on the open roads. The new website continues to get a good amount of traffic, and our hosting service provides some helpful analytics for webmasters to ponder over in their spare time. The following are some highlights of that data which I thought were worth sharing with all. From the last 12 months of traffic to your website at www.britishbootsandbonnets.com, the following patterns emerged:

- 1 An average of 171 visitors per month (from March 2016 to February 2017, with September, August and June being the busiest months). That's an average of 5.7 visitors each day.
- 2 Those visitors viewed an average of 450 pages each month (2.6 pages per visit).
- 3 34% used a mobile device to access the website and 66% are on desktop computers.
- 4 Mobile device use ranged from a low of 20% in December & January, to a high of 60% in September. And we saw much more traffic from desktops in December February than the rest of the year. Maybe it's cold outside!
- 5 66% of mobile device users had an IPhone, IPad, of other device using the Apple IOS operating system.
- 6 Top 3 most frequent Page Views: (1) Events, (2) Newsletters, (3) Event Photos.
- 7 Top referrers (this is how people found us): (1) 59% went to the site directly, (2) 19% searched on Google, (3) 18% came from other British car club websites (Iowa, Chicagoland MG, ISOA, Vintage MG, etc.). And worth noting, 3% came from the Moss Motors website.
- 8 Log-in times ranged from 02:12 am to 11:43 pm.

One thing this traffic report demonstrates once again - it is very important for everyone (members and officers) to send me event information for the calendar as early as possible; a few photos after each event for the picture gallery; monthly newsletters, general club announcements, and of course new & current member pics with cars. For example, to date we have no 2017 event photos to post, and I especially need everyone's help with these pages on the club's website.


Funeral services were held Tuesday, March 7, 2017. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to the American Cancer Society or to the MS Society.






